#### Call to Order

The Todd County Board of Commissioners met in the Commissioner's Board Room in the City of Long Prairie, MN on the 3<sup>rd</sup> day of June, 2025 at 9:00 AM. The meeting was called to order by Vice-Chairperson Denny. The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance. All Commissioners were present except Commissioner Byers.

#### **Approval of Agenda**

On motion by Noska and second by Becker, the following motion was introduced and adopted by unanimous vote: To adopt the agenda as presented with the addition of item 4.8 Authorization to Hire Public Works Summer Help – Chet Hudalla, 4.9 Hiring of Jessica Moore – Resource Conservationist and 9.1 Discussion in regards to Sanctuary County status.

#### **Consent Agenda**

On motion by Becker and second by Neumann, the following motions and resolution were introduced and adopted by unanimous vote:

#### **GAMBLING PERMIT – NWTF STRUTTIN BLACKBEARDS**

#### **Ditch/Ag Inspector**

On motion by Noska and second by Becker, the following resolution was introduced and adopted by unanimous vote:

#### HOLD HARMLESS AGREEMENT – DITCH MAINTENANCE – COUNTY DITCH 32

**WHEREAS,** Caroline Beckman & Alison McGinnity are requesting to maintain approximately 3,440 feet of Lateral #3 on CD32 that is located on their parcels 24-0016000, 24-0016300 & 24-0016400. A Hold Harmless Agreement has been signed and submitted to the Ditch Authority, and;

WHEREAS, an onsite inspection has been done, and;

**WHEREAS,** the landowners are allowed to maintain the drainage ditch to the original width, depth and grade. An improvement by lowering or widening the ditch bottom is not allowed. Sediment and vegetation can only be removed to the extent of the original ditch bottom elevation. Spoil must be side cast and leveled, staying within 16.5 feet of the ditch.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED,** the Todd County Ditch Authority gives permission to Caroline Beckman & Alison McGinnity to maintain approximately 3,440 feet of Lateral #3 on CD32 that is located on parcels 24-0016000, 24-0016300 & 24-0016400, Turtle Creek Twp section 17. This maintenance will be done on their own property and at their own expense.

### LOCAL BRIDGE REPLACEMENT PROGRAM GRANT AGREEMENT 1057425 GRANT TERMS AND CONDITIONS SAP 077-599-065

**WHEREAS**, Todd County has applied to the Commissioner of Transportation for a grant from the Minnesota State Transportation Fund for construction of Bridge #77J93, and;

WHEREAS, the Commissioner of Transportation has given notice that funding for this project is available, and;

WHEREAS, the amount of the grant has been determined to be \$185,010.25 by reason of the lowest responsible bid.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED,** be it resolved that Todd County does hereby agree to the terms and conditions of the grant consistent with Minnesota Statutes, section 174.50, and will pay any additional amount by which the cost exceeds the estimate, and will return to the Minnesota State Transportation Fund any amount appropriated for the bridge but not required. The Todd County Board Chairperson and Todd County Auditor/Treasurer are authorized to execute a grant agreement and any amendments thereto with the Commissioner of Transportation concerning the above-referenced grant.

#### **RECITALS**

- 1. Minnesota Statutes § 174.50, subd. 6-7 authorize the State to enter into this agreement.
- 2. General Funds were appropriated for the Local Bridge Replacement Program in Minnesota Laws 2023, Chapter 68-H.F. 2887.
- 3. Grantee has been awarded Local Bridge Replacement Program (LBRP) funds under Minn. Stat. § 174.50, subd. 6-7.
- 4. Grantee represents that it is duly qualified and agrees to perform all services described in this agreement to the satisfaction of the State. Pursuant to <a href="Minn.Stat.§16B.98">Minn.Stat.§16B.98</a>, Subd.1, Grantee agrees to minimize administrative costs as a condition of this agreement.

#### AGREEMENT TERMS

#### 1 Term of Agreement, Survival of Terms, and Incorporation of Exhibits

- 1.1 **Effective Date.** This agreement will be effective on the date the State obtains all required signatures under Minn. Stat.§16B.98, Subd. 5. As required by Minn.Stat.§16B.98 Subd. 7, no payments will be made to Grantee until this agreement is fully executed. Grantee must not begin work under this agreement until this agreement is fully executed and Grantee has been notified by the State's Authorized Representative to begin the work.
- 1.2 Expiration Date. This agreement will expire on December 31, 2028, or when all obligations have been satisfactorily fulfilled, whichever occurs first.
- 1.3 **Survival of Terms.** All clauses which impose obligations continuing in their nature and which must survive in order to give effect to their meaning will survive the expiration or termination of this agreement, including, without limitation, the following clauses: 8. Liability; 9. State Audits; 10. Government Data Practices and Intellectual Property; 11. Workers Compensation; 12. Governing Law, Jurisdiction, and Venue; and 14. Data Disclosure.
- 1.4 **Exhibits.** Exhibit A: Sources and Uses of Funds Schedule; Exhibit B: Grant Application; and Exhibit C: Grantee Resolution Approving Grant Agreement are attached and incorporated into this agreement.

#### 2 Grantee's Duties

- 2.1 Grantee will conduct one or more of the following activities in accordance with its grant application, or in the case of legislatively selected projects, in accordance with the enabling session law, which is attached to this Agreement as Exhibit B: (i) constructing or reconstructing a bridge, (ii) abandoning an existing bridge that is deficient and in need of replacement, but where no replacement will be made, or (iii) constructing a road to facilitate the abandonment or removal of an existing bridge determined to be deficient.
- 2.2 Grantee will comply with all required grants management policies and procedures set forth through Minn. Stat. §16B.97, Subd. 4 (a) (1).
- 2.3 **Asset Monitoring.** If Grantee uses funds obtained by this agreement to acquire a capital asset, the Grantee is required to use that asset for a public purpose for the normal useful life of the asset. Grantee may not sell or change the purpose of use for the capital asset(s) obtained with grant funds under this agreement without the prior written consent of the State and an agreement executed and approved by the same parties who executed and approved this agreement, or their successors in office.

#### 3 Time

3.1 Grantee must comply with all the time requirements described in this agreement. In the performance of this grant agreement, time is of the essence.

#### 4 Consideration and Payment

- 4.1 **Consideration.** The State will pay for all services performed by Grantee under this agreement as follows:
  - 4.1.1 **Compensation.** Grantee will be reimbursed for actual, incurred costs that are eligible under Minn. Stat. § 174.50, subd 6-7. Grantee shall use this grant solely to reimburse itself for expenditures it has already made to pay for the costs of one or more of the activities listed under section 2.1.
  - 4.1.2 **Sources and Uses of Funds.** Grantee represents to State that the Sources and Uses of Funds Schedule attached as Exhibit A accurately shows the total cost of the project and all of the funds that are available for the completion of the project. Grantee agrees that it will pay for any costs that are ineligible for reimbursement and for any amount by which the costs exceed State's total obligation in section 4.1.3. Grantee will return to State any amount appropriated but not required.
  - 4.1.3 **Total Obligation.** The total obligation of the State for all compensation and reimbursements to Grantee under this agreement will not exceed \$185,010.25.

#### 4.2 Payment

- 4.2.1 **Invoices.** Grantee will submit state aid pay requests for reimbursements requested under this grant agreement. The State will promptly pay Grantee after Grantee presents an itemized invoice for the services actually performed and the State's Authorized Representative accepts the invoiced services.
- 4.2.2 All Invoices Subject to Audit. All invoices are subject to audit, at State's discretion.
- 4.2.3 **State's Payment Requirements**. State will promptly pay all valid obligations under this agreement as required by Minnesota Statutes §16A.124. State will make undisputed payments no later than 30 days after receiving Grantee's invoices and progress reports for services performed. If an invoice is incorrect, defective or otherwise improper, State will notify Grantee within ten days of discovering the error. After State receives the corrected invoice, State will pay Grantee within 30 days of receipt of such invoice.
- 4.2.4 **Grant Monitoring Visit and Financial Reconciliation.** During the period of performance, the State will make at least annual monitoring visits and conduct annual financial reconciliations of Grantee's expenditures.
  - 4.2.4.1 The State's Authorized Representative will notify Grantee's Authorized Representative where and when any monitoring visit and financial reconciliation will take place, which State employees and/or contractors will participate, and which Grantee staff members should be present. Grantee will be provided with at least seven calendar days of notice prior to any monitoring visit or financial reconciliation.
  - 4.2.4.2 Following a monitoring visit or financial reconciliation, Grantee will take timely and appropriate action on all deficiencies identified by State.
  - 4.2.4.3 At least one monitoring visit and one financial reconciliation must be completed prior to final payment being made to Grantee.
- 4.2.5 **Unexpended Funds.** The Grantee must promptly return to the State at grant closeout any unexpended funds that have not been accounted for in a financial report submitted to the State.
- 4.2.6 **Closeout.** The State will determine, at its sole discretion, whether a closeout audit is required prior to final payment approval. If a closeout audit is required, final payment will be held until the audit has been completed. Monitoring of any capital assets acquired with grant funds will continue following grant closeout.
- 4.3 Contracting and Bidding Requirements. If Grantee is a municipality as defined by Minn. Stat. § 471.345, subdivision 1, then Grantee shall comply with the requirements of Minn. Stat. § 471.345 for all procurement under this Agreement.

#### **5 Conditions of Payment**

All services provided by Grantee under this agreement must be performed to the State's satisfaction, as determined at the sole discretion of the State's Authorized Representative and in accordance with all applicable federal, state, and local laws, ordinances, rules, and regulations. The Grantee will not receive payment for work found by the State to be unsatisfactory or performed in violation of federal, state, or local law.

If Grantee's Authorized Representative changes at any time during this agreement, Grantee will immediately notify the State.

#### 7 Assignment Amendments, Waiver, and Grant Agreement Complete

- 7.1 **Assignment.** The Grantee may neither assign nor transfer any rights or obligations under this agreement without the prior written consent of the State and a fully executed Assignment Agreement, executed and approved by the same parties who executed and approved this agreement, or their successors in office.
- 7.2 **Amendments.** Any amendments to this agreement must be in writing and will not be effective until it has been executed and approved by the same parties who executed and approved the original agreement, or their successors in office.
- 7.3 **Waiver.** If the State fails to enforce any provision of this agreement, that failure does not waive the provision or the State's right to subsequently enforce it.
- 7.4 **Grant Agreement Complete.** This grant agreement contains all negotiations and agreements between the State and Grantee. No other understanding regarding this agreement, whether written or oral, may be used to bind either party.
- 7.5 **Electronic Records and Signatures.** The parties agree to contract by electronic means. This includes using electronic signatures and converting original documents to electronic records.
- 7.6 **Certification.** By signing this Agreement, the Grantee certifies that it is not suspended or debarred from receiving federal or state awards.

#### 8 Liability

Grantee and State agree that each will be responsible for its own acts and the results thereof to the extent authorized by law, and neither shall be responsible for the acts of the other party and the results thereof. The liability of State is governed by the provisions of Minn. Stat. Sec. 3.736. If Grantee is a "municipality" as that term is used in Minn. Stat. Chapter 466, then the liability of Grantee is governed by the provisions of Chapter 466. Grantee's liability hereunder shall not be limited to the extent of insurance carried by or provided by Grantee, or subject to any exclusion from coverage in any insurance policy.

#### 9 State Audits

Under Minn. Stat. § 16B.98, Subd.8, the Grantee's books, records, documents, and accounting procedures and practices of Grantee, or other party relevant to this grant agreement or transaction, are subject to examination by the State and/or the State Auditor or Legislative Auditor, as appropriate, for a minimum of six years from the end of this agreement, receipt and approval of all final reports, or the required period of time to satisfy all state and program retention

requirements, whichever is later. Grantee will take timely and appropriate action on all deficiencies identified by an audit.

#### 10 Government Date Practices and Intellectual Property Rights

10.1 **Government Data Practices.** Grantee and State must comply with the Minnesota Government Data Practices Act, Minn. Stat. Ch. 13, as it applies to all data provided by the State under this grant agreement, and as it applies to all data created, collected, received, stored, used, maintained, or disseminated by the Grantee under this agreement. The civil remedies of Minn. Stat. §13.08 apply to the release of the data referred to in this clause by either Grantee or the State.

#### 11 Workers Compensation

The Grantee certifies that it is in compliance with Minn. Stat. §176.181, Subd. 2, pertaining to workers' compensation insurance coverage. The Grantee's employees and agents will not be considered State employees. Any claims that may arise under the Minnesota Workers' Compensation Act on behalf of these employees and any claims made by any third party as a consequence of any act or omission on the part of these employees are in no way the State's obligation or responsibility.

#### 12 Governing Law, Jurisdiction, and Venue

Minnesota law, without regard to its choice-of-law provisions, governs this agreement. Venue for all legal proceedings out of this agreement, or its breach, must be in the appropriate state or federal court with competent jurisdiction in Ramsey County, Minnesota.

#### 13 Termination; Suspension

- 13.1 **Termination by the State.** The State may terminate this agreement with or without cause, upon 30 days written notice to the Grantee. Upon termination, the Grantee will be entitled to payment, determined on a pro rata basis, for services satisfactorily performed.
- 13.2 **Termination for Cause.** The State may immediately terminate this grant agreement if the State finds that there has been a failure to comply with the provisions of this agreement, that reasonable progress has not been made, that fraudulent or wasteful activity has occurred, that Grantee has been convicted of a criminal offense relating to a state grant agreement, or that the purposes for which the funds were granted have not been or will not be fulfilled. The State may take action to protect the interests of the State of Minnesota, including the refusal to disburse additional funds and requiring the return of all or part of the funds already disbursed.
- 13.3 **Termination for Insufficient Funding.** The State may immediately terminate this agreement if:
  - 13.3.1 It does not obtain funding from the Minnesota Legislature; or
  - 13.3.2 If funding cannot be continued at a level sufficient to allow for the payment of the services covered here. Termination must be by written or fax notice to the Grantee. The State is not obligated to pay for any services that are provided after notice and effective date of termination. However, the Grantee will be entitled to payment, determined on a pro rata basis, for services satisfactorily performed to the extent that funds are available. The State will not be assessed any penalty if the agreement is terminated because of the decision of the Minnesota Legislature, or other funding source, not to appropriate funds. The State will provide the Grantee notice of the lack of funding within a reasonable time of the State's receiving that notice.
- 13.4 **Suspension.** The State may immediately suspend this agreement in the event of a total or partial government shutdown due to the failure to have an approved budget by the legal deadline. Work performed by the Grantee during a period of suspension will be deemed unauthorized and undertaken at risk of non-payment.

#### 14 Data Disclosure

Under Minn. Stat. § 270C.65, Subd. 3, and other applicable law, Grantee consents to disclosure of its social security number, federal employer tax identification number, and/or Minnesota tax identification number, already provided to the State, to federal and state tax agencies and state personnel involved in the payment of state obligations. These identification numbers may be used in the enforcement of federal and state tax laws which could result in action requiring the Grantee to file state tax returns and pay delinquent state tax liabilities, if any.

15 **Fund Use Prohibited.** The Grantee will not utilize any funds received pursuant to this Agreement to compensate,

either directly or indirectly, any contractor, corporation, partnership, or business, however organized, which is disqualified or debarred from entering into or receiving a State contract. This restriction applies regardless of whether the disqualified or debarred party acts in the capacity of a general contractor, a subcontractor, or as an equipment or material supplier. This restriction does not prevent the Grantee from utilizing these funds to pay any party who might be disqualified or debarred after the Grantee's contract award on this Project.

- 16 Discrimination Prohibited by Minnesota Statutes §181.59. Grantee will comply with the provisions of Minnesota Statutes §181.59 which requires that every contract for or on behalf of the State of Minnesota, or any county, city, town, township, school, school district or any other district in the state, for materials, supplies or construction will contain provisions by which Contractor agrees: 1) That, in the hiring of common or skilled labor for the performance of any work under any contract, or any subcontract, no Contractor, material supplier or vendor, will, by reason of race, creed or color, discriminate against the person or persons who are citizens of the United States or resident aliens who are qualified and available to perform the work to which the employment relates; 2) That no Contractor, material supplier, or vendor, will, in any manner, discriminate against, or intimidate, or prevent the employment of any person or persons identified in clause 1 of this section, or on being hired, prevent or conspire to prevent, the person or persons from the performance of work under any contract on account of race, creed or color; 3) That a violation of this section is a misdemeanor; and 4) That this contract may be canceled or terminated by the state of Minnesota, or any county, city, town, township, school, school district or any other person authorized to grant contracts for employment, and all money due, or to become due under the contract, may be forfeited for a second or any subsequent violation of the terms or conditions of this Agreement.
- 17 **Limitation.** Under this Agreement, the State is only responsible for receiving and disbursing funds. Nothing in this Agreement will be construed to make the State a principal, co-principal, partner, or joint venturer with respect to the Project(s) covered herein. The State may provide technical advice and assistance as requested by the Grantee, however, the Grantee will remain responsible for providing direction to its contractors and consultants and for administering its contracts with such entities. The Grantee's consultants and contractors are not intended to be third party beneficiaries of this Agreement.

#### 18 Additional Provisions

- 18.1 **Prevailing Wages.** Grantee agrees to comply with all of the applicable provisions contained in Minnesota Statutes Chapter 177, and specifically those provisions contained in Minn. Stat.§. 177.41 through 177.435 as they may be amended or replaced from time to time with respect to the project. By agreeing to this provision, Grantee is not acknowledging or agreeing that the cited provisions apply to the project.
- 18.2 **E-Verification.** Grantee agrees and acknowledges that it is aware of Minn.Stat. § 16C.075 regarding e-verification of employment of all newly hired employees to confirm that such employees are legally entitled to work in the United States, and that it will, if and when applicable, fully comply with such order.
- 18.3 **Telecommunications Certification.** If federal funds are included in Exhibit A, by signing this agreement Grantee certifies that, consistent with Section 889 of the John S. McCain National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2019, Pub. L. 115-232 (Aug. 13, 2018), Grantee does not and will not use any equipment, system, or service that uses "covered telecommunications equipment or services" (as that term is defined in Section 889 of the Act) as a substantial or essential component of any system or as critical technology as part of any system. Grantee will include this certification as a flow down clause in any contract related to this agreement.
- 18.4 **Title VI/Non-discrimination Assurances.** Grantee agrees to comply with all applicable US DOT Standard Title VI/Non-Discrimination Assurances contained in DOT Order No. 1050.2A, and in particular Appendices A and E, which can be found at: <a href="https://edocs-public.dot.state.mn.us/edocs\_public/DMResultSet/download?docId=11149035">https://edocs-public.dot.state.mn.us/edocs\_public/DMResultSet/download?docId=11149035</a>. If federal funds are included in Exhibit A, Grantee will ensure the appendices and solicitation language within the assurances are inserted into contracts as required. State may conduct a review of the Grantee's compliance with this provision. The Grantee must cooperate with State throughout the review process by supplying all requested information and documentation to State, making Grantee staff and officials available for meetings as requested, and correcting any areas

of non-compliance as determined by State.

18.5 Use, Maintenance, Repair and Alterations. The Grantee shall not, without the written consent of the State and the Commissioner, (i) permit or allow the use of any of the property improved with these grants funds (the Real Property) for any purpose other than in conjunction with or for the operation of a county highway, county state-aid highway, town road, or city street or for other uses customarily associated therewith, such as trails and utility corridors, (ii) substantially alter any of the Real Property except such alterations as may be required by laws, ordinances or regulations, or such other alterations as may improve the Real Property by increasing its value or which improve its ability to be used for the purposes set forth in section (i), (iii) take any action which would unduly impair or depreciate the value of the Real Property, (iv) abandon the Real Property, or (v) commit or permit any act to be done in or on the Real Property in violation of any law, ordinance or regulation.

If the Grantee fails to maintain the Real Property in accordance with this Section, the State may perform whatever acts and expend whatever funds necessary to so maintain the Real Property, and the Grantee irrevocably authorizes the State to enter upon the Real Property to perform such acts as may be necessary to so maintain the Real Property. Any actions taken or funds expended by the State shall be at its sole discretion, and nothing contained herein shall require the State to take any action or incur any expense and the State shall not be responsible, or liable to the Grantee or any other entity, for any such acts that are performed in good faith and not in a negligent manner. Any funds expended by the State pursuant to this Section shall be due and payable on demand by the State and will bear interest from the date of payment by the State at a rate equal to the lesser of the maximum interest rate allowed by law or 18% per year based upon a 365-day year.





#### 2025 TODD COUNTY INTERIM FINANCING FOR CAP GRANT PROJECT

#### AND TRANSFER OF FUNDS AUTHORIZATION

**WHEREAS,** Todd County received a \$4,000,000 Capital Assistance Program (CAP) grant through the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA) and \$2,795,000 from the Minnesota General Fund to construct a new Transfer Station Building, Scale house and associated exterior improvements at the existing Transfer Station Facility in Browerville (Project), and;

**WHEREAS,** on March 19, 2024 the Todd County Board of Commissioners approved financing for the project whereby the total project budget was established at \$10,197,156.43. Local match (Todd County, including solid waste department) funding was set at \$3,402,156.43. This includes funding from ARP and Solid Waste Department with a loan from the General Fund.

**WHEREAS,** Todd County awarded the majority of the work (less equipment, engineering, etc.) in the Project to Hy-Tec Construction on March 19, 2024. The work awarded to Hy-Tec has a substantial completion date of September 20, 2025.

**WHEREAS,** The State of Minnesota entered into an Agreement with Todd County effective December 31, 2021 for the \$4,000,000 CAP Grant. These funds have all been reimbursed to Todd County for work completed.

**WHEREAS,** The MPCA and State of Minnesota have not prepared a grant agreement for the additional \$2,795,000 committed by the State Legislature. State of Minnesota staff have indicated that the money can remain encumbered without an agreement until December 31, 2027.

**WHEREAS,** The Solid Waste Department does not expect it can pay for the remaining cost of the project without the aforementioned state funding. Recently, pay requests were received from the general contractor (Hy-Tec) that have not been paid in the amount of approximately \$1,497,206. The Solid Waste Department desires to find an interim funding source in case the State of Minnesota continues to be delayed in its obligations.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED,** the Todd County Board of Commissioners does hereby authorize interim financing from the General Fund for the Project to be called upon for up to 18 (eighteen) months for an amount not to exceed \$2,795,000 (Two million, seven hundred ninety-five thousand and 00/100 dollars) at an interest rate of zero (0) percent. Repayment of this advance to coincide with the State of Minnesota's delivery of funding per the CAP Grant Agreements.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** that the Todd County Board of Commissioners does hereby authorize the County Auditor-Treasurer to transfer the requested funds, as necessary to coincide with vendor payment withdrawals for CAP Grant project expenses, in an amount not to exceed \$2,795,000 in total from Fund 01-General Revenue to Fund 51-Solid Waste based on the monthly cash balance of the Fund 51-Solid Waste.

#### I. BACKGROUND

There are three changes to the Project that the Department of Solid Waste recommend formalizing by change order. A summary of the changes is provided in Table 1, below, with the intent to consolidate approved changes into one change order, CO-3:

**Table 1: Proposed Hy-Tec Change Orders**

A. Electrical to Loading Ramp (PR-6)	\$7,218.16
B. Plumbing Plan Review (PR-7)	\$43,900.98

These items are mandatory for proper function of the facility, and compliance with state law. We have reviewed them with Stantec and believe the actual cost to the County for each item should be lower – each for a different reason. Stantec committed to providing more information to adjust County Costs before the meeting.

#### II. SUPPORTING INFORMATION

Attached is a summary of Contingency Action costs and remaining balance. Following is a brief description of each change:

#### A. Electrical to Loading Ramp

Design team inadvertently did not include wiring to power the overhead door to the loadout ramp. Had it been included in the design, the actual cost of the project would be higher. Adding by change order adds additional cost because it is a non-competitive pricing process.

#### **B.** Plumbing Plan Review

In April 2025, approximately 10 months after furnishing a plumbing permit, the Department of Labor and Industry (DLI) decided that run-off collected in the loadout bay could not be pumped to the ground. Stantec has prepared a design and received approval from DLI.

#### C. Exterior Concrete Flatwork

The bidding documents show the roll-offs stored on a gravel surface. We want them on a concrete surface. At the request of county staff, contractor poured concrete in this area and reduced by equal area the concrete used to access the loadout bay. Our understanding is that the pricing for this work should be calculated based on the unit prices furnished during the bidding process. We do not recommend an increase in payment for this change.

#### **CONTINGENCY FUNDS**

The project was set up with a contingency fund. Below is a summary of uses and remaining balance of the contingency fund:

# MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT BETWEEN LAKE COUNTRY ASSOCIATES AND TODD COUNTY HEALTH & HUMAN SERVICES

**THIS AGREEMENT** is made and entered into by and between Lake Country Associates and Todd County Health & Human Services.

- WHEREAS, the provision of mental health consultation services to home visitors is a requirement of the Promising Practices family home visiting grant.
- WHEREAS, Lake Country Associates has the professional requirements to provide mental health consultation services for home visitors.
- WHEREAS, Todd County Health & Human Services, empowered by the Todd County Board of Commissioners, has the authority to enter into an agreement with Lake Country Associates.

#### THEREFORE,

 Lake Country Associates, specifically Jessica Niemi, will provide virtual mental health consultation to Todd County Health & Human Services' home visitors each month. Lake Country Associates will get prior approval for other duties requested.

#### Liability:

- Each Requesting Party shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless a Responding Party for claims arising within the Requesting Party's jurisdiction subject to the limits of liability under Minnesota Statutes Chapter 466 and other applicable law, rule, and regulation, including common law. The purpose of creating this duty to defend, indemnify and hold harmless, is to simplify the defense of claims by eliminating conflicts among defendants that are parties to this Agreement.
- For purposes of the Minnesota Municipal Tort Liability Act (Minn. Stat. Ch. 466), the employees and officers of the Responding Party are deemed to be employees (as defined in Minn. Stat. § 466.01, subdivision 6) of the Requesting Party, but only for purposes of addressing liability under this Agreement. The employees of the Responding Party shall not be considered employees of the Requesting Party for any other purpose.

#### **Consideration and Terms of Payment:**

Consideration of all services performed, and goods supplied pursuant to this agreement shall be paid by Todd County Health & Human Services as follows:

- Virtual consultation for 2 hours each month at a rate of \$175 per hour from July 1, 2025-June 30, 2028.
- Cancellation of virtual consultations less than 24 hours' notice will incur full payment.
- Work outlined by this contract must be completed by Jessica Niemi to be reimbursed.
- Lake Country Associates will submit an invoice monthly to Todd County HHS following the work being completed.

#### **Purpose of Position**

The purpose of the Assistant County Attorney (ACA) position is to provide professional legal services on behalf of Todd County as directed by the County Attorney. This includes prosecuting criminal, juvenile, and traffic offenses; representing the County in civil and administrative matters; and advising County departments, boards, and officials on legal issues. Responsibilities also include representing the County in matters involving child protection, child support enforcement, paternity, guardianships, conservatorships, and civil commitments.

Assistant County Attorneys are expected to manage a wide variety of legal work, ranging from routine cases to complex, sensitive, or high-stakes litigation.

#### **Basic Performance Expectations of all Todd County Staff**

- Serves as a positive example to other County personnel with regard to workplace actions, decisions, work skills, attitude and adherence to workplace policy and procedures.
- Has strong communication and interpersonal skills, is honest, fair and dependable.
- Embodies teamwork and cooperation within and across County departments and with the public.
- Communicates effectively with the Department Head and keeps supervisor apprised of important matters ongoing in the department.
- Respect all colleagues, co-workers, board members and the public and lead those around you to do the same.
- This position requires regular and timely attendance in accordance with the department schedule.
- Performs other duties as assigned or apparent.

#### **Position Specific Essential Duties and Responsibilities**

The following duties are normal for this position. These duties are not to be construed as exclusive or all-inclusive. Other duties may be required as assigned. To perform this job successfully, an individual must be able to perform each essential function satisfactorily.   - Conduct legal research, draft legal opinions, and provide advice and counsel to County departments, the County Board, elected officials, and employees regarding applicable laws and regulations.
  - o Draft and review legal documents including contracts, ordinances, resolutions, and agreements to ensure legal sufficiency and compliance.
  - Negotiate contracts, settlements, and similar legal matters on behalf of the County.

- SafeAssure clients may utilize multiple training formats and techniques including but not limited to:
  - On-site training with Power Point presentations, workbooks, videos, and topical employee participation games (see schedule).
  - Online training through video/question-answer as well as client-specific OSHA safety information.
- SafeAssure provides <u>online safety training</u> and complete documentation of individual employee training on most subjects (see schedule) for employees directed by management to do online training (such as during shutdowns, new employees, or employees who missed on-site training).
- All documents and classroom training produced by SafeAssure for Todd County are for the sole and express use by Todd County and its employees and not to be shared, copied, recorded, filmed, digitized, or used by any division, department, subsidiary, or parent organization or any entity whatsoever, without prior <u>written approval</u> of SafeAssure.
  - **Data Practices Act.** All government data collected, created, received, maintained, or disseminated for any purpose by the Parties pursuant to this Agreement shall be governed by the provisions of the Minnesota Government Data Practices Act, Minn. Stat. §§ 13.01 et seq. ("the Data Practices Act"). Contractor agrees to comply with the Data Practices Act as it applies to any data provided to it by the County or third parties, and further agrees to cooperate and assist County staff in complying with any data practices requests arising out of, or related to, information generated or submitted pursuant to the contract.
- All programs, policies, training, and procedures referenced on the following page <u>do</u>
   <u>not</u> include the cost of hardware such as labels and signs. It will be the responsibility of
   Todd County to obtain this hardware as required to comply with OSHA standards.
- All time spent consulting, answering questions, and assisting with OSHA inspections both on and off-site are part of the agreement services and are included (see also schedule).
- Any additional classroom subjects/hours separate from the agreement and schedule
  will be billed and eligible for all "current client" discounts offered by SafeAssure not to
  exceed \$800 per 2-hour training session. These hours (if any) will only be allowed
  upon approval of Todd County management representative and SafeAssure.

# A Resolution Expressing Concerns Regarding the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's "Sanctuary Jurisdiction" Designation for Todd County

WHEREAS, the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS) recently released a public list designating 20 Minnesota counties, including Todd County, as so-called "sanctuary jurisdictions;" and

WHEREAS, DHS has not promulgated an official definition of "sanctuary jurisdiction;" and

WHEREAS, this "sanctuary jurisdiction" designation was made without consultation, clearly defined criteria, or notice to Todd County in advance of the public release; and

WHEREAS, this lack of communication placed local officials in the difficult position of responding to media inquiries and constituent concerns without any explanation or context for this "sanctuary jurisdiction" designation; and

WHEREAS, Minnesota state law **prohibits the detention of individuals for more than 48 hours without formal charges**, thereby limiting the ability of counties to comply with certain ICE requests; and

WHEREAS, this "sanctuary jurisdiction" designation could lead to **serious and unfair consequences**, including potential loss of critical federal funding that supports public safety and essential community services; and

WHEREAS, national organizations such as the National Sheriffs' Association and the National Association of Counties have expressed similar concerns regarding the **lack of clarity, transparency, and due process** in the DHS designation process.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Todd County Board of Commissioners **formally objects** to the designation of Todd County as a "sanctuary jurisdiction" and expresses **deep concern** about the lack of communication and transparency demonstrated by DHS in this matter.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board requests that our Minnesota Congressional Delegation to advocate for:

- 1. **Immediate clarification** from DHS regarding the criteria and methodology used in making "sanctuary jurisdiction" designations;
- 2. A **transparent and accountable process** that includes notice, input, and the opportunity for so-called "sanctuary jurisdictions" **to appeal** this designation;
- 3. **Assurances** that Minnesota counties, including Todd County, will **not be unfairly penalized**, especially in terms of federal funding vital to public safety and community well-being.

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the U.S. Department of Homeland Security, the Association of Minnesota Counties, and our Minnesota Congressional Delegation, as a formal statement of Todd County's position that DHS's arbitrary "sanctuary jurisdiction" designation for Todd County is unfounded and inaccurate.
