

Early in 1965 after an intensive educational campaign by a steering committee of county commissioners and interested people, 170 petitioners circulated among Todd County landowners to petition the Minnesota Soil Conservation Commission to form a soil and water conservation district for Todd County. Over 1200 signatures were obtained.

Responding to the petition, the Commission held a hearing in the county. More than 120 people appeared and again responded favorably. On the March 24 referendum, the people voted 571 to 54 to organize a soil and water conservation district. March 29 the Commission approved the formation and appointed Percy Perreton, Carlos, and Wayne Voge, Bertha, for one and two year terms of office respectively. The Secretary of State issued an organization certificate April 12, 1965 and the remaining three board members were elected June 2.





- All People, All Spaces. The people in Todd County are as diverse as its resources; different generations, cultures, politics, socio-economic stats, and origins. Todd SWCD will build connections between the citizens and the natural spaces in which they live, work, and recreate. Work will include steps to present media in alternate languages; reaching out to absentee landowners, classroom and youth education, and conducting site visits for any size property from lawns to forests. (Todd SWCD Staff and Management)
- Safe Passages. Travel corridors are important to the health and economy of the people. Todd SWCD appreciates the cities, public works, contractors and township road departments. Todd SWCD is available to work with these entities to ensure road, bridge, and culvert improvements have the least impacts to natural hydrology. When asked, Todd SWCD will review sites and plans, provide feedback, help with the identification of possible improvement projects, and offer cost-share for qualifying projects. The focus will be on projects that have a direct impact on natural hydrology systems including flow direction, flow volumes and velocity.

 (Todd SWCD Riparian Team)
- Hard Surfaces Equal More Water.... Somewhere. All land uses impact water infiltration from stormwater. From roads, driveways, and parking lots, to roof tops, stairs, parks, cemeteries, ballfields and lawns; to shoreline riprap, construction site, heavy equipment use, feedlots, tiles, and tillage. Todd SWCD is committed to providing information to the people of Todd County on these impacts and alternative practices. Land use guides, videography, newsletters, talk shows, partnering with Planning and Zoning, presentations, and one on one site visits will occur throughout the seasons to those who desire to learn how to best protect our natural resources. (SWCD Staff and Supervisors)
- Droughts and Floods. Fire and Ice. Life and Death. Changes in weather and climate impact all life: bacteria, microscopic lifeforms, bugs, mollusks, animals, plants, invasive species, algae, humans, grasslands and forests. In turn, the health of these lifeforms can alter the enjoyment of your property. People have a tendency to blame their neighbors or others for these impacts. However, the cause and most practical solution is often much closer than one might expect, maybe even right below your feet. Todd SWCD wants to help remedy problems landowners are facing due to climatic interference by offering solutions and cost-share on the property owned by that landowner, not on other peoples' lands. The first step to problem solving is the one you take when you open your door to face Mother Nature.

Soil Profiles. Natural resource protection and the resiliency of communities all tie back to the soil upon which we build our lives. For long term protection and resiliency of Todd County, Todd SWCD will focus on building healthy farms, healthy forests, healthy yards, and healthy landscapes. Productivity can be enhanced through increasing diversity in microbiology, reducing soil compaction, restoring water storage and water holding capacities, and better nutrient management. Todd SWCD offers assistance in native plantings, Lawns to Legumes and similar programs, cover crops, reduced tillage, forest stewardship plans, and tree plantings— all to improve the soil profile. (SWCD Technical Staff)

What do safe passages have to do with protecting water and soil?

Hundreds of years ago, water paths were not altered except by Mother Nature- maybe a tree fell or a bank collapsed during flooding. Other than that, water ran freely across the landscape. With human settlement came roads and pathways. We filled, we blocked, we culverted. Creating obstacles in any natural cycle has long term consequences, and Mother Nature finds a way to overcome in ways humans do not always appreciate. Flooded roads threaten transport, commerce, and emergency response situations. Floodwaters cause turbulence of bottom sediments adding nutrients, erode soils and compacted road materials carrying all sort of particulates into the water from the road surface. As floodwaters reside, damage to water quality can be seen up to months and years later in algal blooms, restricted water flow from sandbars and debris from which invasive cattails may prosper, and other unanticipated results. This featured article, written by Todd SWCD technician, Josh Votruba tells how costshare can help assist both the landowner, and in this case Todd County Public Works in achieving safer passages.



In 2024, the Todd County Soil and Water Conservation District (SWCD) completed a livestock crossing and fencing cost-share project located in Moran Township. The goal of this project was to address a sediment and nutrient resource concern due to unrestricted cattle access to an intermittent stream located on a property near the Long Prairie River. This particular property, was of concern to the Todd SWCD due to the large amounts of sediment leaving the property via an intermittent stream. The cattle, as they accessed the stream, would cause instream erosion and bank erosion which would cause sediment to dislodge and flow downstream and plug up a culvert located under a county road. The property is also located very close to the Long Prairie River, which was of concern. The issue with the plugged-up culvert was first brought to the Todd SWCD's attention by Todd County Public Works, as they were tasked with cleaning out the culvert under the county road on an annual basis.

Todd SWCD Aids in "Safe Passages" through Cost—shared projects

To address the issue with the sediment and nutrients entering the stream, the Todd SWCD worked with the landowner and the West Central Technical Service Area (WCTSA) Engineer to design a project that would allow for the cattle to cross the stream without causing instream erosion and dislodging sediment, and to restrict the cattle access to the stream and its adjacent wetlands on the property. The components of the final engineered design are listed below.

- 3150 linear feet of exclusion fence were installed to limit cattle access to the stream and its adjacent wetlands. Gates were installed throughout the fence to still allow for flash grazing in the wetland and riparian areas in times of drought.
- A 500 linear foot earthen diversion was installed just south of feedlot/barn to divert feedlot runoff away from the stream to an existing grass meadow field on east side of property.
- 20-foot-wide cattle crossing with a rock rip rap spill-way was installed to allow for a stable crossing for cattle and equipment over the stream. A 24-inch dual wall pipe 40 feet in length was installed within the crossing to allow for continued flow within the stream.
- An approximately 20,000 square foot area of disturbed soil adjacent the stream downstream of the crossing was seeded and mulched to stabilize the soil. This area was fenced out to allow for vegetative regrowth.

With this project now completed, significant reductions in sediment and nutrients leaving the property should be expected as a result of the completed project. The fencing will allow areas previously disturbed by cattle to revegetate and heal, stabilizing the soils adjacent to the stream while also significantly reducing in stream erosion. In addition, the earthen diversion component of the project will prevent any feedlot runoff from entering the stream directly. Overall, this completed project will make a great positive impact on water quality for the Long Prairie River Watershed.

Photos above indicate the volume of sediment building up in the county road ditch on both the east and west sides of the road every year. The problem was caused by erosion due to lack of vegetation along the streambank and cattle disturbance upstream.





Photo A above shows the erosion and much disturbance where the cattle crossed the stream from one pasture to the next. **Photo B** is taken from the same vantage point, after construction, showing the restricted cattle—cross area with an appropriately sized culvert below the gravel pad. **Photo C**, below left, shows other areas of the stream void of vegetation, prior to the project, where cattle congregated for shade and water. **Photo D**, bottom right, shows the healing process of revegetation now that the cattle are fenced off from this area. Public Works should see benefits to the culvert under the county road in the years to come.







Todd SWCD Board Prioritizes Outreach to Todd County Residents on Stormwater Runoff from Impervious Surfaces (Hard Surfaces = More Water)



This picture shows a typical parking lot after a strong summer rainstorm. Parking lots and roads, which are examples of impervious surfaces, where water runs off into local streams instead of soaking into the ground, act as "fast lanes" for rainfall to make its way into streams and other surface waters. Rain that falls on a parking lot that has been baking in the sun all day during summer gets super heated. This heated water can be a shock to the aquatic life and can, thus, harm the water quality of the stream.



Lakeshores are subject to a variety of erosion-causing factors: natural wave action, wake boats, floods, iceheaves, rodents, construction run-off, and recreational foot traffic. Lakeshores throughout Minnesota have been stripped of their native landscapes and replaced with "clean cut" lawns we call turf grass. Concerning soil stability, these are worst case scenarios. Cleanly shorn, vibrantly green lawns have very shallow root systems, averaging 2" in depth, and cannot withstand even moderate wave action. Rain water flows across the top and does not soak through this fibrous mat of shallow roots. Over time, the shoreline experiences soil loss and land cuts reducing lake frontage. Soil particles end up in the lake, carrying phosphorus to fester algal blooms and causing "turbidity" -cloudy, brown tinted water. These types of "green impervious surfaces" have become a serious water quality issue for many lakes in Todd County.

hanks to the organizational skills of Jamie Christenson, Land Use Planner, Todd County Planning and Zoning and Todd SWCD co-sponsored the highly attended 2024 Contractors Meeting. Todd SWCD knows that efficient conservation action relies heavily on the skilled knowledge/operational expertise and *willingness* of local contractors to take on SWCD conservation projects. It starts with listening to what the contractors have to say—what works; what doesn't, and sharing with contractors the required rules that must be followed when implementing cost-

shared practices, in particular.

In the 2024 meeting, Todd County Planning and Zoning covered Septic Ordinance Updates. Todd SWCD covered topics such as working with multiple contractors, new bid and invoice requirements, project time frames when working under a grant activity, the Wetland Conservation Act - Contractor Responsibility Form., and types of stormwater and sediment controls used during construction.

Per recommendation by contractors, Todd SWCD requires landowners who work with the SWCD to be in good stand-

ing with County taxation processes and have no existing governmental land use violations in order to apply for cost-share assistance. Contractors have also requested the option of a Direct to Contractor Payment for landowners who opt to go that route. This had been in place in the past, and was removed per state recommendation in 2021. Todd SWCD Board of Supervisors will sought information form the Board of Soil and Water Resources and the County Attorney. AS it now stands, Todd SWCD cannot list a contractor as the sole name on a cost-share check. Thank you to the many contractors who attended this meeting!

odd County, as well as other parts of the State and Country, have received a dose of reality when it comes to extreme weather in recent years. 2024 was no different. Whether it has been straight line winds, tornadoes, torrential downpours, heavy smoke from wild fires, or extreme periods of drought, fortitude and resiliency, not blame, are needed to overcome these challenges. As was shown in the efforts of the Clarissa and Eagle Bend communities after the 2022 tornadoes demolished half of Eagle Bend, Todd County communities unite, not fight, in times like these

Spring of 2024 brought some torrential down pours, flooding many parts of Todd County, particularly the northern regions. One such event came at the very close of a landowner cost-share project—just as it was buttoning up and the last gravel graded. See picture on directly right.

This project was a livestock crossing and exclusion fence on the Partridge River just north of Clarissa. Throughout a typical year, the Partridge river appears to be more of a wetland flow than a river with the exception of the spring thaw. But on June 2, last year, after receiving 8 inches of rain, it became a mighty roaring white water river, rising many feet over night, and over topping the newly laid gravel and rock outlet.

There is no project designed heavy enough to withstand sudden or massive storm events so the contractor, engineer and

SWCD technicians were a little nervous as to what they might find when they returned to the sight after the storm. (See image on right.)

Surprisingly, the project held up quite well despite having many feet of high velocity water overtopping it. The picture below shows the exposed rock base and disturbed construction fabric, still in good condition that was the result of the



The Todd Soil and Water Conservation Board of directors swiftly identified and approved additional fund sources for the repair while and the project was re-armored and solidified for the pasture season. No fingers were pointed.





Events such as these are referred to as "Acts of God" in which no one can prepare for or protect under extreme conditions.

Typically, landowners are responsible for the cost to maintain a project without cost-share, but in the case of "An Act of God", funds can be made available for repairs during the 10 year project contract with the SWCD.

espite the dry fall, farmers went ahead with their soil health practices after the 2024 fall harvest. Working closely with Todd SWCD Farm Conservation Technicians, Tim Ebnet and Dylan Pratt, and the new Soil Health Practitioner, Alyssa Scheve, farmers learned which tillage methods and crops would be the most successful under the current conditions. Though the seed remained dormant in some weeks until it could catch some moisture, the crops came up. Farmers experimented with no till and strip still practices

this year, and four Todd County farmers were awarded Soil Health equipment grants from the MN Department of Agriculture.

Farmers have shared that, in wet years or dry, the fields they put under soil health practices are the first fields they can get on in the spring, and the most productive out of any in dry falls. On the next page, we will share an example of one such project as presented to the Todd SWCD Board of Supervisors. Currently, Todd SWCD cost shares soil health practices at 75%.

Interesting Factoids- Excerpt from Plan:

The deer population is too high. Meanwhile, 44 of the 65 species of migrant bird species that nest in these forests have reductions in populations. Both of these are likely due to fragmented forests for land use development and forest loss due to agriculture.

There are woodland prairies on this property. Species include goldenrod, Kentucky bluegrass, milkweed, aster, wild strawberries and raspberries. Also gooseberry and leatherwood shrubs exist which indicate rich and fertile soil for growing trees. Meadow rue, bloodroot, ginger, moss and trillium cover the forest floor

Kandota soils grow excellent red pine stands that are easily established. Can mix with oak, basswood, and maple. If not planting to trees, leave as native brush, grasses, and wildflowers.

Other deciduous trees found include Burr Oak, Ironwood, Box elder, Aspen, and Elm.

Sadly, the large volume of buckthorn is ruining the diversity and wildlife value of this forest.



odd County was once heavily forested, especially near surface waters.

Forestry contributes to the overall health of the landscape by sequestering carbon, reducing the impacts of flooding through tree root absorption, providing for diversity in plant life, and improving soil health. Well managed forests have a direct correlation to higher water quality of proximal surface and groundwater. Forest diversity helps combat tree disease and other pests while balancing wildlife ecosystems.

Currently Todd SWCD offers technical assistance and costshare for Forest Management.



Forest Management Plans-

Did you know that not all mature forest species or single species plantations (such as pine and aspen) are considered sustainable? What is best for your land when it comes to the health, sustainability, profitability, and/or value of your land?

- Pick a Private Forestry Consultant /Professional Plan Writer to discuss ways in which having a Forest Management Plan, a.k.a. Woodland Stewardship Plan, can improve forest sustainability and value.
- ♦ Apply to **Todd SWCD at 320-732-2644** for 75% costshare to develop a Forest Management Plan. This means you pay for 25% of plan writing costs and the grant will cover the rest (not to exceed \$1200).

The Rules: The landowner must apply for the cost-share <u>BE-FORE</u> the Plan writing begins and payments will not be issued until after the DNR approves the Plan.

DNR Cost-Share-

Forest management is a long term commitment. You may need to plant additional trees, thin or selectively cut old stagnant trees, stabilize soil areas that are eroding, and control pests or invasive species like buckthorn, etc. Thankfully, those with easements or land enrolled under the Sustainable Forest Incentive Act (SFIA qualify for cost–share from the DNR to help cover costs associated with forest management. 




Todd SWCD Stimulates Local Economy in 2024: Completes 63 projects Valuing 1.2 Million Dollars.

ost-share grants provide up to 75% cost-share to landowners in Todd County wishing to make environmental enhancements to their properties that result in a reduced number of pollutants entering both surface and ground water, providing habitat for wildlife, and keeping prime farmland soils in place while improving overall soil health. Todd SWCD often works in conjunction with West Central Technical Service Area which provides engineering support for larger scaled projects. While most of our projects are ecological in nature, the engineering efforts of WCTSA in Todd County were estimated at 3.1 million dollars resulting in 1.5 million dollars of engineered practices being installed in Todd County alone in 2024. Beyond the value of the project, these projects bring income to local taxpayers who own and operate businesses in Todd County, from cafés to lumber and beyond, a "fan effect exists. Todd SWCD doubled it's project numbers from 2023 to 2024. On top of that, grants are used to reimburse the county for employee wages and operational costs. Much of the work Todd SWCD does supports other county departments such as Planning and Zoning or Public Health, and the overall Comprehensive Plan objectives, making it a win, win for all






urning off of County 11 into the Lions Fairy Lake Park, the prairie grasses were flushed by a myriad of native wild flowers. Moths, crickets, grasshoppers, beetles, butterflies, blue darning needles, bumble bees, honey bees, and dragonflies zipped from blossom to blossom, filling the air with the mesmerizing buzz of late summer. The oak savanna in the background was rippling as the aging leaves rustled with whispers of autumn just around the corner. Small waves lapped the sandbeach shore, the lawn areas were well maintained, and it was here that I met up with Ken Meier, a local representative for the Fairy Lake Lions. The Fairy Lake Lions, a subset club of the Sauk Centre Lions Club, is dedicated strictly to the betterment of Fairy Lake Park.

Many decades ago, the land on which the park now sits was generously donated by two ladies with one stipulation: the land was not to be developed for housing. A Board was formed called the Fairy Lake Lions, and the park was opened as a small swimming beach. Over the years, public amenities were added to include a parking lot, picnic tables, shelters, renovated restrooms, playground equipment, benches, volleyball courts and a disc golf course.

As time passed, with all the good changes, some other changes as recalled by Meier and the board members were not so good. The vegetation surrounding the park was changing. The first noticeable change was that an invasive buckthorn undergrowth was multiplying at a rapid rate through the tangled thicket forest. Invasive buckthorn is an all too common understory shrub with an extensive, fibrous root system that quickly weaves through the upper layers of soil on the forest floor. The shrub can grow up to 25 feet high and outcompetes other native species. The forest floor becomes a monoculture (lone specie) and chokes out the once diverse mixed species forest. Buckthorn serves as a overwinter shelter for soybean aphid eggs. It

also disrupts the balance of the natural world, pushing out desirable native understory plants and creating a dark, dense thicket. Ken Meier was one of the first board members to contact the DNR Division of Forestry for help. An excerpt written by Jason Kern, Resource Protection Forester, details the resolution by the Lions:

In late 2017, DNR Forestry was invited out to visit with the Lions Club in relation to management of invasive buckthorn in cooperation with Todd County Soil and Water Conservation District. I visited with Ken Meier and discussed options for the wooded areas of the park and their heavy infestation of buckthorn. I attended a full meeting of the Lions Club in Sauk Centre in December of 2017 to present to the club membership on invasive buckthorn, why it is a problem, and options for control in the park. The full club membership asked many good questions along with great involvement in making a final decision to treat the buckthorn in their park.

I developed a technical plan for heavy mechanical removal of buckthorn along with hand removal where machinery could not operate, along with assisting with providing the club DNR Forestry Cost Share for the control project. Once it was approved, the Lions Club obtained a contractor to conduct the mechanical removal of the heavy infestation along with some hand cutting treatment. In the summer of 2018, the mechanical treatment using a forestry mulching machine was completed. The following year in 2019, chemical application in the understory treated the remaining regeneration and newly seeded buckthorn. The Lions Club has also used volunteers to pull buckthorn in parts of the forested areas, and continues to treat the small amount of buckthorn in the park. Now it is a manageable effort.

The engagement of the membership of the Lions Club and partnering with DNR Forestry resulted in a great achievement of a now healthy forest type that can be enjoyed by all users of the park, as well as showing the public that even heavy infestations of buckthorn can be brought down to a manageable level. Since then, I have advised the Club on various forestry related questions and concerns in management of their resource at the park. They are active and knowledgeable, and wish to leave a good legacy, provide a high quality recreational area for the public, and be good stewards of their property. It has been a privilege to work with them on these projects. ~ Jason Kern, Resource Protection Program Forester - Division of Forestry, Minnesota Department of Natural Resources

Once the buckthorn was controlled, the Lions began work with U.S. Fish and Wildlife (USFWS) on the remnant Oak Savanna. What is meant by the term *Oak Savanna*?






Quick facts

Common buckthorn is a **Restricted noxious weed**. It is illegal to import, sell or transport buckthorn in Minnesota.

- Common buckthorn is found in oak forests, savannas, prairies and riparian woods.
- · It completely eliminates plant diversity in the understory over time.
- · It thrives on well-drained soils.
- Plants leaf out early and hold their leaves late into the fall, creating dense shade.
- · Seeds have a laxative effect on birds, aiding in seed dispersal.
- · Common buckthorn is the overwintering host for the soybean aphid.

Common buckthorn should be reported. The Minnesota Department of Natural Resources provides detailed recommendations for reporting invasive species.

Oak Savannas are unique transition ecosystems that bridge the gap between the arid prairieland and the moister forest systems found in the Midwest. The land-scape across Todd County represents the boundary of these two dominant ecosystems. Oak Savannas are made up of several distinctive species of grasses, wildflowers, and shrubs amongst widely-spaced oak trees. The dominant tree species in Oak Savannas are bur oaks followed by black, red, white and pin oaks, also known as Hill's oak.



The floor of the Oak Savanna is a mixture of woody and herbaceous shrubs, forbs (wildflowers), prairie and other native grass species. The diversity of species found in the Oak Savannas is substantially greater than the woodland ecosystem or the prairie ecosystem, combined. This is evident by walking through the now restored Oak Savannas at Fairy Lake Park.

Ken Meier was very pleased by those involved in the forest restoration. He mentioned a logger from Browerville, a "one man show". "He came in with his fellow buncher, laid down the box elders and larger buckthorn and got the job done. He was amazing! Carr's Tree Service (Freeport)are also excellent."

Once the buckthorn became successfully managed, the club followed through by reseeding the savanna. The restoration project was designed by John Riens of US Fish & Wildlife Services. Areas to restore included the native understory, addressing road edges in the park, scouring out the non-native reed canary and timothy grasses from the grassland areas and reseeding with natives to restore the succession of the Oak Savanna. These pictures are representative of how the Oak Savannas stand today two years after the native understory and prairie seeding.





A buckthorn thicket once monopolized the forest understory. Without intervention, natural or human, the forest will eventually die off.

Next order up for the Fairy Lakes Lions' Club was a request from Fairy Lake residents to restore an original lake outlet that had been blocked off by the creation of the beachfront, decades ago. Residents living on Fairy Lake were witnessing shoreline damage, loss of trees, erosion, and higher water levels that were threatening properties and placing septic systems at risk. Todd SWCD found aerial photos showing how the lake used to outlet to a wetland area near the park's volleyball courts in high water periods of the past. In recent decades, the lake was instead using an outlet north of the park on County 11. This was at a Todd County Public Works

culvert. The culvert was designed to drain the wetland on the east side of County 11 *into* the lake, thus protecting the roadway during high precipitation events or spring thaws. However, for as long as many residents can remember, the designed inlet has served as the alternative outlet for the lake resulting in flooding to the east to a farm field , *below*, in detriment to Ash-



ley Creek. Volumes of field sediment were carried and deposited each year into the creek lowering its water quality and contributing to the downstream turbidity of the Sauk River.



After several meetings with Todd Soil and Water technical staff, West Central Area Engineer, Ross Reiffenberger, P.E., the Sauk River Watershed District, Todd County Public Works, attorneys, the Department of Natural Resources (DNR), and several government agencies and officials including the late MN Representative John Poston, the Fairy Lake Lions Club approved an easement to allow the Fairy Lake Association to install a metered outlet slightly above the DNR Ordinary High Mark.



This plan was pre-vetted through an engineer impact study. The project was cost-shared by Todd Soil and Water. Now, whenever the lake water is abnormally high, rising above the ordinary high, it can seep through the new outlet to the original storage wetland at Fairy Lake Park as opposed to the County 11 culvert. This occurs without additional cause for field erosion and impacts to downstream waters or landowners.

The Fairy Lake Lions Club also assisted the DNR in bringing the original <u>inlet</u> back up to grade by offering free sand, rock, and other construction material offered by the park.



While years in the making, a fourth habitat restoration project still in the planning stages addresses the park wetland. Because the original outlet wetland stopped receiving overflow waters with the impediment of the beachfront, the native habitat within the wetland was altered. Invasive hybrid cattails have taken over much of the slough area changing the macroinvertebrate species, fauna and flora. The Fairy Lakes Lions Club will continue to work with John Riens of the USFWS to eventually restore the wetland back to its native condition. Together with the Sauk Centre Lions, the club hopes to create a nature trail dotted with educational signage and stop points

for curious children and adults to learn more about the wildlife native to beautiful Fairy Lake. Fairy Lake is a high quality Lake of Biological Significance for the State of Minnesota for several native species of plants and fish.

At a time when native shoreland is disappearing faster than programs can install restoration projects, the Fairy Lakes Lions Club is role modeling how leadership and civic organizations can step up to the plate to serve the people, future generations, and the environment all together. Todd SWCD is proud to recognize the Fairy Lakes Lions Club for their continued efforts to do what is right and good for communities of all types, wild and civilized, and for families and citizens of all ages and backgrounds. Todd SWCD formally awards the Fairy Lakes Lions Club the Todd County Land Stewardship Award for 2024!







Ken Meier, left, has served on the Lions Club for 38 years and counting. "You have to be asked to join the club. It's an honor", he says. The Lions Club is one of the largest clubs, worldwide. The club's motto is "We Serve". "We care for those less blessed." The club, as example, provides hearing aids and eye glasses for those in need and collects shoes for the Soles4Souls organization, shipping over 28,000 pairs of much needed shoes to Africa and other parts of the world. The Fairy Lake Lions Club, an offshoot of the Sauk Centre Lions, created a board a decade ago to help make decisions for the future of Fairy Lake Park. "It's a great board", says Meier. He worries there may be less interest to carry on after the board ages out. He encourages others to take the first step. The point of the park is to create a space for community. "People come from all over the state to enjoy the beach and the park", says Meier. He commends the public for how well they have taken care of the park over the years. He hopes the next generation sees the rewards of caring for the park, the lake, each other, and the environment.



The West Central Technical Service Area (WCTSA) provides free engineering services for those landowners working with the district on cost-shared projects. They cover 12 counties as a whole (*see image, right*) with a current staff of four. In 2024, WCTSA engineering staff conducted 270 site visits and surveys, developed 193 preliminary and 131 final design plans, while overseeing the construction of 73 completed projects. In Todd County alone, they are currently working on 10 feedlot projects, 16 field erosion sites, 14 shoreline projects, and 5 nonclassified projects. Five projects were installed to certification in Todd County in 2024, with several others in mid-construction.

What is holding you back?

Forty-six (46) farms in Todd County have completed their Ag Water Quality Assessments covering 14,374 acres of ground. Across the State of Minnesota, 1,569 farms are Ag Water Quality Certified covering 1,137,314 acres.

What does it mean to be AG Water Quality certified?

To become "Ag Water Quality certified" means a farmer or landowner has been recognized by the Minnesota Agricultural Water Quality Certification Program (MAWQCP) for actively implementing conservation practices on their land that protect water quality. By becoming MAWQCP certified, a farm is demonstrating a com-

mitment to managing their farm in a way that minimizes environmental impact on nearby waterways; essentially signifying they are actively working to safeguard water quality through their agricultural practices. In the certification process, a farmer's land is scored of regarding conservation management, and is given a variety of viable solutions in areas where a lower score is assigned, often with economic benefits. In addition to this certification, farms qualify for both mini grants and some larger scale grants as priority ranking to help cover the cost of a project. It might cover fencing, or installing a more stable tile outlet, for example. This program has no cost, and no farmer is obligated to make the changes required to become AG Water quality certified. However, many famers discover that minimal changes are needed to become certified, and that is a measure of confidence, right there. Wetland Conservation Act Updates

As of August 1st, 2024, the Minnesota State Legislature implemented new statute changes to the Wetland Conservation Act (WCA) which regulates wetland impacts. Relevant statue changes that could affect Todd County landowners regarding WCA exemptions are briefly summarized below.

Agricultural activities - The exemptions regarding wetlands on agricultural lands that were cropped in six of the last ten years prior to January 1, 1991 and wetlands located on pasture land meeting certain wetland type and acreage requirements was removed. New update - for wetland impacts on agricultural land authorized by the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) and Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS), a Certified Wetland Determination is required for the use of the Agricultural Exemption.

Drainage – The exemption regarding wetlands on agricultural lands that were annually seeded or in a crop rotation with pasture grass, cover crop, or legumes for eight out of the ten most recent years prior to the impact was removed.

De minimis (Wetland Fill) – Impactable wetland amounts (prior to requiring a replacement plan) were updated. New update - A replacement plan is not required for wetlands: located outside the shoreland protection zone up to one-tenth acre (4,356 square feet), wetlands located within the shoreland wetland protection zone, but beyond the

shoreland building setback zone up to 100 square feet, and wetlands within the shoreland building setback zone (as defined in the local shoreland management ordinance) up to 20 square feet.

Note, the above statute updates are highlighted for relevancy, but are brief and summarized. Additional updates to the WCA were not included within this article. Well Sealing and Cost Share Funds Available to Help with the Cost

Wherever you live in Minnesota – northwoods, farm country, small town, or big city – you could have one or more wells on your property. A well may have been your home's main water source before city water became available, or it was installed to serve secondary buildings and barns, or used to water lawns or gardens.

Wells are no longer used for a variety of reasons:

- Not enough water.
- Needed repairs.
- Became contaminated.
- Simply "lost" or abandoned when property changed hands.
- Land use changed.

Connected to a community water system.


Every unused well that is not properly sealed poses a safety, health, and environmental threat to your family and community as well as a potential legal risk to the homeowner.


Physical safety

Children and small animals can easily fall into an unprotected, open well. Also, accidents can occur when equipment is unsuspectingly driven over a crumbling well or well pit.


Health and environment

An unused well can act like a drain, allowing surface water runoff, contaminated water, or improperly disposed waste a direct pathway into drinking water sources. When this occurs, the quality of everyone's water is threatened – city water wells, neighbor's wells, even your current well. Therefore, it is recommended that homeowners test their water annually. Your local Soil and Water Conservation offices have cost share funds available to help cost share between 50-75% of the cost to seal the well. You must contact your local Soil and Water office prior to any work being completed if your interested in the cost share funds to help with the cost to seal the well. MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

This agreement (Agreement) is made and entered into between:

The Counties of Becker, Cass, Crow Wing, Hubbard, Todd, and Wadena by and through their respective County Board of Commissioners, and

The Becker, Cass, Crow Wing, Hubbard, Todd, and Wadena Soil and Water Conservation Districts, by and through their respective Soil and Water Conservation District Board of Supervisors Collectively referred to as the "Parties."

WHEREAS, the Counties of this Agreement are political subdivisions of the State of Minnesota, with authority to carry out environmental programs and land use controls, pursuant to Minnesota Statutes Chapter 375 and as otherwise provided by law; and

WHEREAS, the Soil and Water Conservation Districts (SWCDs) of this Agreement are political subdivisions of the State of Minnesota, with statutory authority to carry out erosion control and other soil and water conservation programs, pursuant to Minnesota Statutes Chapter 103C and as otherwise provided by law; and

WHEREAS, the White Earth Nation is a federally recognized Indian Tribe with both inherent authority and delegated federal authority to carry out environmental programs and land use controls, and with statutory authority, pursuant of Minnesota Statutes Section 471.59, to enter into joint powers agreements with other state governmental units; and

WHEREAS, the Parties to this Agreement have a common interest and statutory authority to assure implementation of a comprehensive watershed management plan in the Crow Wing River Watershed to conserve soil and water resources through the practices, programs, and regulatory controls that effectively control or prevent erosion, sedimentation, siltation and related pollution in order to preserve natural resources, ensure continued soil productivity, protect water quality, reduce damages caused by floods, preserve wildlife, protect the tax base, and protect public lands and waters; and

WHEREAS, with matters that relate to the coordination of water management authorities pursuant to Minnesota Statutes Chapters 103B,103C, and 103D with public drainage systems pursuant to Minnesota Statutes Chapters 103E, this Agreement does not change the rights or obligations of the public drainage system authorities.

WHEREAS, the Parties have formed this Agreement for the specific goal of implementing the Crow Wing River Comprehensive Watershed Management Plan, which was developed pursuant to Minnesota Statutes § 103B.801, Comprehensive Watershed Management Planning, also known as *One Watershed, One Plan*.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Parties hereto agree as follows:

- 1. **Purpose:** The Parties to this Agreement recognize the importance of partnerships to plan and implement protection and restoration efforts for the Crow Wing River Watershed (See Attachment A: Implementation Area Map). The purpose of this Agreement is to collectively implement, as local government units, the Crow Wing River Comprehensive Watershed Management Plan. Parties signing this agreement will be collectively referred to as the Crow Wing River Watershed Collaboration, partnering together in this Agreement as an exercise of joint powers under Minn. Stat. Section 471.59.
- Term: This Agreement is effective upon signature of all Parties in consideration of the Board of Water and Soil Resources (BWSR) Participation Requirements for participation in Watershed Based Implementation Funding; and will remain in effect until cancelled according to the provisions of this Agreement, unless

earlier terminated by law. This Agreement end date will run concurrent with the BWSR grant agreement end date of December 2033. Parties may revisit the grant agreement end date and make extensions to the term of the grant agreement if agreed upon by the Policy Committee (the structure, membership, and governing provisions of the Policy Committee are described in a later paragraph in this Agreement).

- 3. Adding Additional Parties: A qualifying party within the Crow Wing River Comprehensive Watershed Management Plan Area that is responsible for water planning and resource management according to Minnesota State Statutes desiring to become a member of this Agreement shall indicate its intent by adoption of a governing board resolution. The Resolution shall be mailed to the existing Policy Committee, and upon receipt by the Policy Committee, the qualifying party shall become a member of the Policy Committee. The qualifying party agrees to abide by the terms and conditions of this Agreement, including but not limited to the bylaws, policies and procedures adopted by the Policy Committee.
- 4. Withdrawal of Parties: A party desiring to leave this Agreement shall indicate its intent in writing to the Policy Committee in the form of an official board resolution. Notice must be made at least 30 days in advance of leaving the Agreement.

5. General Provisions:

- a. Compliance with Laws/Standards: The Parties agree to abide by all federal, state, and local laws; statutes, ordinances, rules, and regulations now in effect or hereafter adopted pertaining to this Agreement or to the facilities, programs, and staff for which the Agreement is responsible. All Parties to this Agreement will be given the option to opt out within 30 days after new federal, state or local laws, statutes, ordinances, rules, and regulations are adopted and become effective, which increase or decrease the responsibilities of the Parties pertaining to this Agreement.
- b. Indemnification: Each party to this Agreement shall be liable for the acts of its officers, employees or agents and the results thereof to the extent authorized or limited by law and shall not be responsible for the acts of any other party, its officers, employees, or agents. The provisions of the Municipal Tort Claims Act, Minnesota Statute Chapter 466, and other applicable laws govern the liability of the Parties. To the full extent permitted by law, actions by the Parties, their respective officers, employees and agents, pursuant to this Agreement, are intended to be and shall be construed as a "cooperative activity". It is the intent of the Parties that they shall be deemed a "single governmental unit" for the purpose of liability, as set forth in Minnesota Statutes § 471.59, subd. 1a(a). For purposes of Minnesota Statutes § 471.59, subd. 1a(a) it is the intent of each party that this Agreement does not create any liability or exposure of one party for the acts or omissions of any other party.
- c. Records Retention and Data Practices: The Parties agree that records created pursuant to the terms of this Agreement will be retained in a manner that meets their respective entity's records retention schedules that have been reviewed and approved by the State in accordance with Minnesota Statutes §138.17. The Parties further agree that records prepared or maintained in furtherance of the Agreement shall be subject to the Minnesota Government Data Practices Act. At the time this Agreement expires, all records will be turned over to the Fiscal Agent.
- d. **Timeliness:** The Parties agree to perform obligations under this Agreement in a timely manner and keep each other informed about any delays that may occur.
- e. **Termination:** The Parties anticipate that this Agreement will remain in full force and effect through the term of the grant agreement with BWSR, unless otherwise terminated in accordance with law or other provisions of this Agreement. The Parties acknowledge their respective and applicable

obligations, if any, under Minnesota Statute §471.59, Subd. 5 after the purpose of the Agreement has been completed.

f. Extension: The Parties may extend the termination date of this Agreement for the purposes of implementation the plan beyond the BWSR grant planning phase identified in Section 2 as agreed upon unanimously by the Parties to this Agreement.

6. Administration:

- a. Establishment of a Policy Committee and Advisory Committee for Implementation of the Crow Wing River Comprehensive Water Management Plan. The Parties hereto agree to designate one representative, who must be an elected or appointed member of their governing board, to a Policy Committee for implementation of the Crow Wing River Comprehensive Water Management Plan. The Policy Committee will meet as needed to implement and decide on the content of the work plan.
 - i. Each representative shall have one vote and shall have the authority to act on behalf of their Board regarding mentioned items, grant agreement(s) and amendment(s), interim report review and approval, payments under the grant, professional contracts, and voting on the recommended work plan.

ii. The Policy Committee member will serve as a liaison to their respective boards. Each governing board may choose one alternate to serve on the Policy Committee as needed in the absence of the designated member.

iii. An Advisory Committee will be established to provide technical support on the plan content and Implementation to the Policy Committee, including identification of priorities. The Advisory Committee will be comprised of the Steering Committee, stakeholders, the state's main water agencies, and/or plan review agencies. The Advisory Committee will meet as needed.

iv. A Steering Committee will be established consisting of local staff, county staff, and SWCD staff for the purposes of logistical and day-to-day decision-making in the Implementation process. The Steering Committee will meet as needed.

7. Fiscal Agent agrees to:

- Accept all responsibilities associated with implementing the BWSR grant agreement for developing a watershed-based implementation workplan and sign the grant agreement on behalf of the Parties listed within.
- b. Perform financial transactions as part of the grant agreement and contract implementation.
- Pursuant to Minn. Stat. Section 471.59, Subd. 3, strict accountability of all funds and report of all receipts and disbursements and annually provide a full and complete audit report.
- d. Responsible for fiscal records retention consistent with the agent's records retention schedule.
- 8. Grant Administrator agrees to provide the following services:
 - Accept all day-to-day responsibilities associated with implementing the BWSR grant agreement for watershed-based implementation grant funds.
 - b. Provide the Policy Committee with the records necessary to describe the financial condition of the

BWSR grant agreement.

- c. Be the Day-to-Day Contact for the Crow Wing River Comprehensive Water Management Implementation Plan.
- d. Responsible for the BWSR reporting requirements (E-link).

9. The Plan Coordinator agrees to:

- a. Host the Crow Wing River Comprehensive Watershed Management Plan
- b. Provide a note-taker for all Policy, Advisory, and Steering Committee meetings. Prepare and distribute those notes to the appropriate committees.
- c. Assist the Chair of the Policy Committee with providing an agenda for upcoming meetings.
- d. Notify all committees of upcoming meetings through email and/or phone calls.
- e. May, with the Agreement and consent of the Fiscal Agent, assign any of the foregoing services to the Fiscal Agent who shall perform the services it accepts.

In the event of a vacancy in the above-listed roles, the party responsible for the role will determine if there is adequate capacity within the organization to fulfill the listed role. If the partner agency determines they no longer have capacity and would like to relinquish their duties, they must inform the Policy Committee. The Policy Committee will then reassign the service to another party with the capacity to fulfill the grant agreement.





MASWCD 2025 Legislative Priorities

SWCD Supervisors and Employees,

Thank you for your commitment to advocate on behalf of SWCD funding and policy issues. Here's what you need to know about 2025 legislative priorities set out by the MASWCD board of directors. Additional information and our annual advocacy toolkit will be shared during a **February 4 webinar** (*more details to follow*), and we strongly encourage all SWCDs to attend our March 4 legislative briefing and March 5 SWCD Day at the Capitol.

We will be pursuing these priorities in the context of a busy, somewhat chaotic session. There will be many issues on the table for legislative consideration, so it's important for members to engage and lift up these issues!


SWCD AID

During the 2025 session, state lawmakers will work to pass a budget for the next two years. Together, the House, Senate and Governor will decide how State General Funds will be spent. The General Fund consists of proceeds from income taxes, sales taxes, corporate and other taxes.

While tax issues, including state aids, are not an automatic or necessary component of the state budgeting process, the House and Senate Taxes Committees will be meeting and considering these issues in 2025. The biggest piece of General Fund spending impacting districts is SWCD Aid through the Department of Revenue.

MASWCD worked to get SWCD Aid established during the 2023 legislative session. That year, we sought \$22 million per year in state aid for SWCDs. The end result was \$15 million per year for the first two years, but because budget projections at the time showed a decline in forecasted revenue in future years, this statutory appropriation is set to drop to \$12 million per year for aids payable starting this July 2025.

MASWCD Position. This year, we are again seeking \$22 million per year for SWCD aid. A statewide assessment shows that even at that level, districts statewide experience a shortfall in delivering the services essential to an SWCD (as shown in the above diagram). While \$22 million per year is unlikely to be the amount agreed to by lawmakers due to ongoing concerns about budget projections, we need to continue to bring awareness to our real and chronically unmet funding needs. What's at risk. SWCD workload with implementing comprehensive watershed management plans and

addressing local resource concerns, along with leveraging federal conservation funding opportunities depend on a strong funding commitment from the state. A decrease in SWCD Aid would result in a potential loss of SWCD technical expertise, a reduction in services to private landowners and our natural resources and would put at risk our ability to leverage federal funding for Minnesotans.

CLEAN WATER FUNDS

Lawmakers will take up recommendations from the <u>Clean Water Council</u> on how to appropriate the next two years of Clean Water Funds for the FY26-27 biennium, totaling over \$310 million.

Two Clean Water Fund items are of particular significance to SWCDs and our local implementation efforts. One is Watershed Based Implementation Funding (WBIF), and another is Enhancing Soil Health Practice Adoption.

MASWCD Position. A minimum of \$90 million is needed for Watershed Based Implementation Funding, and \$12 million for Enhancing Soil Health Practice Adoption.

WBIF. SWCDs and other local partners invested time and energy in developing science-based plans for addressing resource concerns on the watershed scale. Once those thoroughly vetted plans are approved by the state, implementation dollars are needed to get voluntary conservation projects on the ground that make progress toward our water quality goals. As additional plans are approved, additional Clean Water Funds are needed to cooperate with private landowners on projects.

What's at risk. A funding level less than \$90 million will result in current SWCD implementation efforts with private landowners to be scaled back and/or will result in recently approved plans not receiving implementation funding.

Soil Health. Clean Water Funds have been a crucial source of supplemental funding for Soil Health efforts.

• What's at risk. Combined with state general fund dollars, these monies leverage federal Regional Conservation Partnership Program funds to help SWCDs accelerate technical expertise and financial assistance for agricultural producers with practices such as cover crops. These are especially important for drinking water and groundwater protection efforts. A funding level less than \$12 million will significantly set back these collective SWCD implementation efforts right at a time they are ramping up and gaining momentum.

CAPITAL INVESTMENT/BONDING

Minnesota has a tradition of selling bonds to pay for some of our long-term investments. Things like roads, bridges, state buildings, and permanent Reinvest in Minnesota (RIM) Reserve Easements all receive bonding as a source of funding. Discussions around bonding investments took place last legislative session, with particular focus on the preservation of existing state assets. However, a final bill was not adopted. It's expected that this session legislators will resume consideration of bonding proposals.

MASWCD Position. Bonding dollars are needed for the Reinvest in Minnesota (RIM) Reserve conservation easement program, administered at the state level by BWSR, and implemented at the local level by SWCDs. A strong bonding appropriation for RIM Reserve should include up to 10% of the appropriation being focused on preserving the state assets in existing RIM easements.

As part of a recently updated agreement, RIM continues to leverage federal Conservation Reserve Program (CRP) funding through the Conservation Reserve Enhancement Program (CREP). Additional acres, practice elements, and eligible SWCDs are part of the updated agreement.

 What's at risk. Interested landowners are waiting to work with SWCDs in this voluntary easement program that has numerous benefits for water quality, soil health, habitat, and climate resilience. Federal leveraging dollars are at risk of going untapped.

The issuance of an Order (as defined below) by Customer to Seller or any communication or conduct of Customer which confirms an agreement for the delivery of Products by Seller, as well as acceptance in whole or in part by Customer of any delivery of Products by Seller, shall be construed as Customer's acceptance of these Terms.

2. OFFERS, ORDERS AND CONFIRMATION

- 2.1. Unless otherwise specified by Seller in writing, all offers made by Seller are not binding and may be revoked by Seller at any time without any liability to Customer.
- 2.2. Customer shall issue to Seller orders for the purchase of Products, in written form via the order process determined by Seller from time to time (each, an "Order"). By issuing an Order to Seller, Customermakes an offer to purchase the Products pursuant to these Terms and the terms set forth on such Order. Provided that the Order contains the same terms as in Seller's corresponding offer, the Order shall be binding on Customer for six (6) weeks after Seller's receipt of such Order.
- 2.3. Seller may refuse an Order for any or no reason. No Order is binding upon Seller until Seller's acceptance of the Order in writing, the issuance of any governmental permit, license, or authority to Seller, as may be required under applicable laws, rules and regulations, and the receipt by Seller of a resale license to be provided by Customer (a "Confirmed Order").
- 2.4. Specifications and other information on drawings, data sheets, pictures, plans, brochures, catalogs, or Seller's website shall not be binding on Seller unless such specifications and information have been agreed to in writing by Seller in a Confirmed Order. Notwithstanding a Confirmed Order, Seller shall have no obligation to deliver Products to Customer or otherwise fulfill any of its obligations set forth in a Confirmed Order if Customer is in breach of any of its obligations hereunder or any Confirmed Order.
- 2.5. Customer may submit to Seller written requests to change the terms of a Confirmed Order (each such request, a "Change Order Request"). Seller may, at its sole discretion, consider such Change Order Request, provided that Seller will have no obligation to perform any Change Order Request unless and until Seller has agreed in writing to adopt such Change Order Request. If Seller elects to consider such a Change Order Request, then Seller shall promptly notify Customer of any adjustment to the applicable purchase price for the Products.
- 2.6. In the event Customer cancels any Confirmed Order for any reason, Customer shall reimburse to Seller all of Seller's costs and

expenses associated with or incurred due to such cancellation, including but not limited to the cost of raw materials, labor, and storage if cancellation occurs before Seller's commencement of production. In the event Customer cancels any Confirmed Order for any reason and Seller has started the production of the Product on the respective Confirmed Order, Customer shall pay to Seller the full purchase price.

2.7. Each Confirmed Order shall be considered a separate agreement between the parties, and any failure to deliver the Products under any Confirmed Order shall have no consequences for other deliveries of Products.

3. PRICES

- 3.1. Unless otherwise agreed to by the parties in the applicable Confirmed Order, the prices of the Products shall be FCA (agreed delivery location on the applicable Confirmed Order), Incoterms 2022.
- 3.2. Unless otherwise agreed by the parties in a Confirmed Order, the price of the Products shall not include transportation, insurance, packaging, and Tooling (as defined below) and other materials used for the manufacturing and delivery, sales or Heavy Vehicle Use Tax (HVUT), other use tax or any other similar applicable federal, state or foreign taxes, duties, levies, or charges in any jurisdiction in connection with the sale or delivery of the Products ("Taxes"), Such Taxes shall be payable by Customer, and if Seller is responsible for the collection thereof, such Taxes shall either be added to the price invoiced or be separately invoiced by Seller to Customer. Any special requests concerning shipping, transportation, and insurance shall be communicated to Seller in a timely manner and subject to Seller's prior written approval. Customer shall bear all costs resulting from such requests.In case of lead delivery times of more than two (2) months, Customer hereby acknowledges and agrees that Seller, may, at its sole discretion, increase or decrease the agreed prices on any Confirmed Order in the event of material price changes in wages, materials, energy or raw material after the date of the Confirmed Order

4. PAYMENT TERMS

- 4.1. Except as set forth in Section 4.2 or unless otherwise agreed in writing by Seller, the purchase price for the Products and all other amounts due under a Confirmed Order shall be due and payable in US dollars within thirty (30) days following the date of Seller's invoice for such Products without any discount, deduction or offset whatsoever. In no event shall any loss, damage, injury or destruction, Force Majeure (as defined below), or any other event beyond Customer's control release Customer from its obligation to make the payments required herein. Payment of all amounts due hereunder shall be made by bank transfer or in any other manner set forth on Seller's invoice. Customer shall be solely responsible for any bank fees, or other fees, incurred due to the wire transfer or any other selected payment method. If Seller agrees to payment by credit card, Seller shall charge an appropriate transaction fee, which the Customer shall also pay.
- 4.2. In the event Seller becomes aware of circumstances or has reason to believe that there are circumstances that may have an adverse effect on Customer's financial condition, Seller may require the Customer to pay the total amount of the purchase price or fees, or a portion thereof prior to the delivery of the Products. Seller may, without any liability to Customer, refuse the delivery of any Product in the event the Customer fails to make the payment as required under this Section 4.2
- 4.3. Time is of the essence for the payment of all amounts due to Seller under any Confirmed Order. If Customer fails to make payments of any amount when due, Customer shall pay interest to Seller at the rate of one percent (1%) per month or such lesser amount as may be permitted by applicable law starting from the due date until payment to Seller of such amount in full. In addition to the interest, Seller may, at its sole discretion, charge the Customer a flat fee of \$40 for each reminder notice issued to Customer due to late payments. If Customer fails to comply with these Terms or a Confirmed Order, or if Customer becomes insolvent, all balances then due and owing to Seller shall become due immediately, notwithstanding any payment terms agreed by the parties. All costs and expenses incurred by Seller with respect to the collection of overdue payments (including, without limitation, reasonable attomey's fees, expert fees, and other expenses of litigation) shall be borne by Customer. Every payment by Customer shall first be

applied to pay for Seller's cost of collection, then interest owed by Customer, and then to the oldest outstanding claim.

4.4. Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing Section 4.3 or Section 5, if the parties agreed on installment payments in a Confirmed Order and Customer fails to make any installment payment when due, the remaining balance including accrued interest, and any expenses incurred by Seller shall be due and payable to Seller promptly upon Customer's receipt of written notice of delinquency from Seller.

5. SECURITY INTEREST

5.1. If Seller extends credit to Customer for the purchase price for any Products (including but not limited to pursuant to Section 4.1.), or any other amounts due to Seller, Customer hereby grants to Seller as security for the timely payment and performance of all Customer's payment obligations to Seller, a first priority security interest (the "Security Interest") in all Products heretofore or in the future delivered to Customer and in the proceeds thereof for as long as such Products shall not have been sold by Customer in the ordinary course of business (the "Collateral"). Seller shall be entitled to file any and all financing, continuation, or similar statements under the Uniform Commercial Code in any jurisdiction and take any and all other action necessary or desirable, in Seller's sole and absolute discretion, to perfect its Security Interest in the Collateral and to establish, continue, preserve, and protect Seller's Security Interest in the Collateral. Customer agrees to take any and all actions and provide Customer with all information necessary to enable Seller to perfect and enforce its Security Interest in all jurisdictions and vis-à-vis any of Customer's creditors, and hereby irrevocably grants to Seller a power of attorney to execute all necessarystatements or documents in Customer's name for the perfection and enforcement of such Security Interest. The Security Interest shall remain in force until payment in full of the entire purchase price for such Products, and any other amounts due to Seller by Customer. Seller may, without notice, change or withdraw extensions of credit at any time.

6. OBLIGATIONS OF CUSTOMER

6.1. Customer shall use the Products solely for their intended purpose and pursuant to Seller's instructions, and agrees to use only qualified personnel for the handling of the Products. Customer shall ensure that its customers, employees, agents, and other representatives comply with this Section 6.1. and shall be responsible for their acts and omissions.

7. DELIVERY AND ACCEPTANCE

- 7.1. Unless otherwise agreed in writing by Seller, all deliveries of Products shall be made FCA (agreed delivery location) (Incoterms 2020) and title to and risk of loss for the Products shall pass to Customer upon delivery pursuant to this Section 7.1.
- 7.2. Any delivery and performance times or dates communicated by or on behalf of Seller are estimates and shall not be binding on Seller. Seller may make partial delivery of Products to be delivered under any Confirmed Order and invoice Customer separately for such partial deliveries or performance. If Customer has not received the Products after six (6) weeks from the estimated delivery date, Customer may make a written request to Seller for delivery. Customer hereby acknowledges and agrees that the actual delivery date of the Products is conditioned upon the complete, accurate and timely delivery of materials from Seller's vendors and suppliers. No delay in delivery of any Productsshall relieve Customer of its obligation to accept the delivery or performance thereof and make payments of any amounts due in accordance with these Terms, including but not limited to delays caused governmental restrictions on exports or imports and similar measures.
- 7.3. Customer's failure to accept the delivery of Products pursuant to a Confirmed Order shall not release or excuse Customer from its obligation to timely pay all amounts due in connection with such Confirmed Order. The Products shall be deemed delivered at the time theyhave been made available to Customer. If Customer rejects or revokes acceptance of Products, or fails to pay any amounts when due, Seller, in its sole and absolute discretion, may extend the period of delivery of Products by such period as Seller may deem reasonable with such period not exceeding three (3) months from the agreed delivery date, or withhold or cancel delivery of any Products, or cancel any or all Confirmed Orders without any further obligations to Customer whatsoever.

In such event, Customer shall be responsible for any and all costs and expenses incurred, or damages or losses suffered by Seller in connection with any such delay notwithstanding any action or inaction by Seller with regard to such delay. Any remaining Products that have not been accepted by Customer within the extended delivery period determined by Seller will be delivered and invoiced by Seller to Customer and Customer agrees to accept such delivery and pay for the purchase price and other amounts payable for the delivered Products.

8. EXAMINATION AND CONFORMITY TO ORDER

- 8.1. Promptly upon receipt of any Products, Customer shall conduct a full and complete inspection of such Products as to any defects and to confirm compliance with all requirements of the applicable Confirmed Order. Customer shall notify Seller in writing of any packaging defects, apparent defects, or non-compliance of such Products with the applicable Confirmed Order that Customer has or could reasonably have discovered during such inspection within seven (7) days from the date of receipt of such Products, and Customer shall notify Seller in writing within three (3) days of the date on which Customer shall first have become aware of any hidden defect or non-compliance which could not reasonably have been discovered during Customer's initial inspection of the Products. Such notification shall include reasonable details (including images) on the alleged defects including lot, batch, or Order numbers.
- 8.2. If Customer fails to timely notify Seller of any defects or other non-compliance of any Products delivered or Customer (or its customers, employees, agents, or representatives) uses, destroys, or modifiesany Products that Customer knows or should have known to be defective or non-compliant without Seller's prior written consent, Customer shall be deemed to have unconditionally accepted such Products and waived all of its claims for breach of warranty or otherwise in respect of such Products.
- 8.3. Customer may only return the Products to Seller with Seller's prior written approval. If the return has been approved by Seller, Customer shall return the Products to Seller at Customer's sole risk and expense to the destination directed by Seller.
- 8.4. Complaints of Customer in connection with the shipping or transport shall be directed to the carrier promptly upon receipt of the delivery or the freight documents.

9. LIMITED PRODUCT WARRANTY

- 9.1. Seller warrants to Customer that the Products will be free of defects in material and workmanship and conform with the requirements set forth in the applicable Confirmed Order for a period of twelve (12) months from the date of delivery for new business Products and ninety (90) days for after sales Products. (the "Limited Product Warranty").
- 9.2. Unless expressly agreed to in writing by Seller, Seller makes no warranty that the Products comply with applicable law, regulations, or specifications in any jurisdiction in which the Products may be used, integrated or incorporated. Any governmental or other approvals necessary in connection with the use, integration or incorporation of the Products shall be Customer's sole responsibility.
- 9.3. The Limited Product Warranty shall be void if the Defect (as defined below) resulted from (a) improper or inadequate use, storage, handling, operation, integration, incorporation, assembly, maintenance, or unauthorized alteration, modification, repair of the Products (including without limitation, the use storage, handling, operation, or integration of the Products contrary to written instructions and/or recommendations of Seller or inadequate training of personnel), (b)changes to construction and materials pursuant to Customer's requests, (c) use of improper tools, resources, or accessories including those but not limited to any third party tools, resources, or accessories that are not approved by Seller or not in accordance with Seller's recommendations, instructions, or directions, (d) acts or omissions of Customer or third parties following delivery of the Product, (e) Customer's failure to properly communicate Seller's instructions and warnings to users of the Products, (f) Customer's, its employees, agents, representatives, customers or any third party's non-compliance with applicable laws, rules and regulation, (g) Force Majeure, or (h) ordinary wear and tear of the Products (e.g., sweep bristles).

- 9.4. In the event of an alleged breach of the Limited Product Warranty (a "Defect"), Customer shall, at Customer's sole expense, send the Product to Seller. Seller shall conduct the necessary tests on such Product within a reasonable period. If Seller confirms the Defect, Sellershall, at its sole option and discretion, repair or replace the Defective Product. If the repair or replacement of the Defective Product is commercially unreasonable to Seller, Seller may, at its sole discretion, issue a refund to Customer in the amount Seller deems adequate. Such repair, replacement, or refund shall be the sole liability of Seller and the sole remedy of Customer with respect to a Defect. In no event shall any warranty claims for a Defect be made after twelve (12) months from the date of Customer's receipt of the Products. Any Products or parts returned to Seller for removal or repair under this Section 9.4 shall be the property of Seller. Any applicable Limited Product Warranty period shall not start anew with the repair or replacement of the Defective Product (or any portion thereof).
- 9.5. Except for Limited Product Warranty, SELLER HEREBY EXPRESSLY EXCLUDES AND DISCLAIMS ANY AND ALL OTHER WARRANTIES, WHETHER EXPRESS OR IMPLIED, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO THE IMPLIED WARRANTIES OF MERCHANTABILITY, FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE OR NONINFRINGEMENT. Seller makes no other warranties with respect to the Products, and no person is authorized to make any warranties on behalf of Seller that are inconsistent with the warranties set forth under this Section 9.

10. LIMITATION OF LIABILITY

- 10.1. IN NO EVENT SHALL SELLER BE LIABLE TO CUSTOMER, ITS CUSTOMERS, EMPLOYEES, AGENTS, AND OTHER REPRESENTATIVES FOR ANY INDIRECT, INCIDENTAL, PUNITIVE, SPECIAL OR CONSEQUENTIAL DAMAGES, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO, DAMAGES FOR LOSS OF PROFITS, REVENUE, GOODWILL, OR USE, WHETHER IN AN ACTION IN CONTRACT, TORT, STRICT LIABILITY, OR IMPOSED BY STATUTE, OR OTHERWISE, EVEN IF SELLER WAS ADVISED OF THE POSSIBILITY OF SUCH DAMAGES. NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OF THE TERMS CONTAINED HEREIN, SELLER'S LIABILITY FOR ANY CLAIM èWHETHER BASED UPON CONTRACT, TORT, EQUITY, NEGLIGENCE, OR ANY OTHER LEGAL CONCEPT è SHALL IN NO EVENT EXCEED THE PURCHASE PRICE PAID BY THE CUSTOMER FOR THE PRODUCTS. GIVING RISE TO SUCH CLAIM, CUSTOMER HEREBY ACKNOWLEDGES AND AGREES THAT THE PROVISIONS OF THESE TERMS FAIRLY ALLOCATE THE RISKS BETWEEN SELLER AND CUSTOMER, THAT SELLER'S PRICING REFLECTS THIS ALLOCATION OF RISK, AND BUT FOR THIS ALLOCATION AND LIMITATION OF LIABILITY, SELLER WOULD NOT HAVE ENTERED INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH CUSTOMER FOR THE SALE OF THE PRODUCTS.
- 10.2. Seller shall not be liable for, and Customer assumes responsibility and shall indemnify, defend, and hold Seller harmless for any and all claims, including without limitation claims for personal injury or property damages, resulting from (a) the improper or inadequate use, storage, handling, operation, assembly, integration, incorporation, assembly, maintenance, or unauthorized alteration, modification, or repair of the Products (including without limitation, the use storage, handling, operation, or integration of the Products contrary to written instructions and/or recommendations of Seller or inadequate training of personnel), (b) changes to construction and materials pursuant to Customer's requests, (c) use of improper tools, resources, or accessories including those but not limited to any third party tools, resources, or accessories that are not approved by Seller or not in accordance with Seller's recommendations, instructions, or directions, (d) acts or omissions of Customer or third parties following the delivery of the Products, (e) Cus etomer's failure to properly communicate Seller's instructions and warnings to users of the Products, or (f) Customer's, its employees, agents, representatives, customers of any third party's non-compliance with applicable laws, rules and regulation, (g) Force Majeure, or (h) ordinary wear and tear of the Products (e.g., sweep bristles).
- 10.3. In jurisdictions that limit or preclude limitations or exclusion of remedies, damages, or liability, such as liability for gross negligence or willful misconduct or do not allow implied warranties to be excluded, the limitation or exclusion of warranties, remedies, damages, or liability set forth in these Terms are intended to apply to the maximum extent permitted by applicable law, and these Terms shall be deemed amended to comply with such limitations or exclusions. Customer may also have other rights that vary by state, country or other jurisdiction.

11. CONFIDENTIALITY

- 1.1. "Confidential Information" means: (i) any know-how, trade secrets, and other business or technical information of Seller that is confidential or proprietary or due to its nature or under the circumstances of its disclosure the Customer knows or has reason to know should be treated as confidential or proprietary, including but not limited to quotations, drawings, project documentation, samples and models.
- 11.2. Confidential Information does not include information that: (i) is or becomes generally known to the public through no fault or breach of these Terms by the Customer; (ii) is rightfully known by the Customerat the time of disclosure without an obligation of confidentiality; (iii) is independently developed by the Customer without use of Seller's Confidential Information; (iv) is rightfully received by the Customer from a third party without restriction on use or disclosure; or (v) is disclosed with Seller's prior written approval.
- 11.3. Customer shall not use Seller's Confidential Information except as necessary to use the Products and will not disclose such Confidential Information to any third party except to those of its employees, agents, subcontractors, or representatives who have a bona fide need to know such Confidential Information to enable Customer to use the Products: provided that each such employee, agent, subcontractor, and/or representative is/are bound by a written agreement that contains use and nondisclosure restrictions not less stringent than the terms set forth in this Section 11.3. The Customer will employ all reasonable steps to protect Seller's Confidential Information from unauthorized use or disclosure, including, but not limited to, all steps that it takes to protect its own information of like importance. The foregoing obligations will not restrict the Customer from disclosing Seller's Confidential Information: (i) pursuant to the order or requirement of a court, administrative agency, or other governmental body, provided that the Customer gives reasonable notice to Seller to contest such order or requirement; (ii) to its legal or financial advisors; and (iii) as required under applicable securities regulations.
- 11.4. In the event of a violation or threatened violation of Customer's obligations under this Section 11, Seller shall be entitled to seek equitable relief, including in the form of a restraining order, orders for preliminary or permanent injunction, specific performance and any other relief that may be available from any court, without the requirement to secure or post any bond, or show actual monetary damages in connection with such relief. These remedies shall not be deemed to be exclusive but in addition to all other remedies available under these Terms, at law, or in equity.

12. INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY

12.1 Seller reserves the sole and exclusive ownership of the intellectual property rights in the Products (including but not limited to the technology used to manufacture the Products) and any improvements thereof regardless of inventorship or authorship. Customer shall not (and shall cause its employees, agents, representatives and customers to not) reverse engineer, decompile, disassemble, or decode any of Seller's intellectual property embedded or used in any of the Product.

13. FORCE MAJEURE

13.1. Seller shall not be responsible for any failure or delay in its performance under these Terms due to causes beyond its reasonable control, including, but not limited to, disruptions of the public power supply, communications, and transportation infrastructure, governmental measures, malware or hacker attacks, fire, extraordinary weather events, epidemics, pandemics (or any government restrictions implemented as a result thereof), nuclear and chemical accidents, earthquakes, war, terrorist attacks, labor disputes, strikes, lockouts, shortages of or inability to obtain labor, energy, raw materials or supplies, or other acts of God.

14. MISCELLANEOUS

14.1. If any provision contained in these Terms or any Confirmed Order is held by final judgment of a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, illegal, or unenforceable, such invalid, illegal, or unenforceable

provision shall be severed from the remainder of these Terms or such Confirmed Order, and the remainder of these Terms or such Confirmed Order shall be enforced. In addition, the invalid, illegal, or unenforceable provision shall be deemed to be automatically modified, and, as so modified, to be included in these Terms, such modification being made to the minimum extent necessary to render such provision valid, legal, and enforceable.

- 14.2. Seller may assign its rights and/or delegate its liabilities under any Confirmed Order at any time. Customer may not assign its rights or delegate its responsibilities under a Confirmed Order without Seller's prior written consent.
- 14.3. Seller's waiver of any breach or violation of these Terms or the provisions of any Confirmed Order by Customer shall not be construed as a waiver of any other present or future breach or breaches by Customer.
- 14.4. The parties hereto are independent contractors and nothing in these Terms will be construed as creating a joint venture, partnership, employment, or agency relationship between the parties.
- 14.5. Notices by a party regarding the exercise of rights and obligations under these Terms must be signed by authorized representatives of such party, and delivered via courier, mail, or e-mail to the other party's address indicated in the applicable Confirmed Order, providedthat a notice by e-mail shall only be validly given if receipt thereof is acknowledged in writing by the recipient.

15. ENTIRE AGREEMENT; CONFLICTS.

15.1. These Terms, including the applicable Confirmed Order, constitute the entire and exclusive agreement of the parties regarding thesubject matter hereof and supersede any and all prior or contemporaneous agreements, communications, and understandings (both written and oral) regarding such subject matter. In the event of a conflict between the provisions of these Terms and the provisions of a Confirmed

Order, the provisions of the Confirmed Order will govern and control. Seller may amend or modify these Terms from time to time. Seller may, at its sole discretion, provide Customer with written notice of any such changes, revisions, amendments, or modifications, provided, however that any such changes, revisions, amendments, or modifications shall become effective without any further action by any party and that they shall not apply to any Confirmed Order prior to the effective date of such changes, revisions, amendments, or modifications

16. APPLICABLE LAW AND JURISDICTION

- 16.1. These Terms and the Confirmed Orders shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Wisconsin without giving effect to any choice or conflict of law provision or rule that would defer to or cause the application of the substantive laws of any jurisdiction other than Wisconsin. The parties hereby expressly exclude the application of the 1980 United Nations Convention on Contracts for the International Sale of Goods.
- 16.2. Any dispute, controversy, or claim arising out of or relating to these Terms and any Confirmed Order, including but not limited to the execution, performance, or termination thereof or to any issue of liability arising out of the performance of these Terms or any Confirmed Order, which the parties have not been able to settle amicably shall be submitted to the exclusive jurisdiction of the state or federal courts with jurisdiction in the County of Calumet, Wisconsin, provided that notwithstanding the foregoing, Seller shall be entitled to seek specific performance and injunctive relief in any court of competent jurisdiction. Each party hereby waives any and all claims, pleas, or defenses (including without limitation a plea for forum non conveniens) that would permit such party to seek the jurisdiction of any courts or arbitration tribunals other than those set forth in the preceding sentence.
- 16.3. EACH PARTY HEREBY WAIVES, TO THE FULLEST EXTENT PERMITTED BY APPLICABLE LAW, ANY RIGHT IT MAY HAVE TO A TRIAL BY JURY IN ANY LEGAL PROCEEDING DIRECTLY OR INDIRECTLY ARISING OUT OF OR RELATING TO THESE TERMS.

Title: Public Health Advisory Committee Policy	
Effective Date: 10/15/2019	Last Review: 2/2025

Purpose:

The Public Health Advisory Committee will provide ongoing and broad-based community input into public health issues that affect Todd County. The Committee shall advise, consult with and make recommendations to the Todd County Board of Commissioners on matters related to development, implementation, funding priorities, evaluations and public relations of Todd County HHS-Public Health.

I. Charge:

A. Development:

- 1. Community needs assessment
 - a. Participate in review of community needs and assessment data.
 - Represent your community and/or organization. Provide community input, perspective and feedback for development and/or maintenance of programs and services.
- 2. Recommend priority problems to be addressed in the Community Health Services Plan.

B. <u>Implementation:</u>

- 1. Provide input for establishing policies governing the services provided.
- 2. Assist the Agency to develop community wide coalitions to initiate needed services and address public health problems.
- 3. Review personnel qualification guidelines to implement services.

C. <u>Funding Priorities:</u>

1. Recommend program priorities based on available funding.

D. Evaluation:

- 1. Participate in the annual review of Agency policies.
- 2. Provide appraisal input to the Todd County Board of Commissioners for the evaluation of the Agency Director.

E. Public Relations:

- 1. Keep informed of the current trends and standard practices in Public Health.
- 2. Assist the Agency to develop and maintain liaison within health and community organizations.

3. Promote understanding and maintain communication about the various Public Health programs and trends with your community and/or organization.

II. Membership and Officers

A. Membership:

- 1. Candidates may be solicited from public notice of interested and affected organizations, community groups, constituencies and/or personal contacts.
- 2. 9-13 members shall be appointed by the Board of County Commissioners. The Committee shall be composed of at least four members as follows:
 - a. The medical consultant or physician.
 - b. A registered or public health nurse.
 - c. A county resident representative of the consumer sector.
 - d. A county commissioner
- 3. Other community and/or professional representatives will be appointed. Such representation may include, but not limited to:
 - a. Education
 - b. Mental Health
 - c. Minnesota Departments of Health and Human Services
 - d. Legal
 - e. Hospitals/Nursing Homes/Clinics
 - f. Media/Radio/Paper
 - g. Extension Service
 - h. Business Sector
 - i. Ministers
 - j. Senior Citizens
- 4. New members may be added as needed as members leave the board.
- 5. Membership policy to be reviewed in 3 years. (Next review 2028)
- 6. Members who miss two (2) consecutive meetings or a total of three (3) meetings during the year without adequate reason may be subject to replacement.
- 7. Committee members shall be allowed travel expense and per diem at the county rate. Necessary expense will be allowed to committee member when attending state conferences or special meetings.

ADOPTION OF CHANGES TO THE TODD COUNTY PERSONNEL POLICY

WHEREAS, the Todd County Board of Commissioners has recognized a need for a strong, up to date personnel policy, and:

WHEREAS, the Todd County Board of Commissioners and Policies Subcommittee have had an opportunity to review the policy revisions put forth in Section 7.24 Employee Recognition Service Awards, of the Personnel Policy and find the implementation to be in the best interest of the sound administration of the County.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that Todd County Board of Commissioners adopts the attached changes to the Todd County Personnel Policy and directs the County Coordinator to begin administration of said policy as of February 18, 2025, and;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that it is understood that this Resolution replaces and supersedes all prior County Board actions, oral or written, relating to the subject matter hereof.

Section 7.22 Sick Hour Conversion

(a) Employees who have accrued over 1040 of sick hours will have 50% of those hours converted to cash and deposited into their post-retirement health care savings account. The conversion will take place once a year at year-end.

Section 7.23 Todd County HCSP for Elected Officials

- (a) A plan for elected offices including the county attorney, auditor-treasurer, recorder, sheriff and county commissioners has been developed as they are ineligible to participate in the plan outlined under Section 7.17 since they do not accumulate sick leave severance benefits. In an effort to balance this, elected officials are afforded an opportunity to participate in the HCSP under this program:
 - (i) Elected officials who have completed at least one term shall contribute 1% (percent) of their annual salary into the HCSP plan.
 - (ii) The county of Todd shall contribute into the HCSP a lump sum payment of \$3,000 per term upon completion of their second term and subsequent terms thereafter.

Section 7.24 Employee Recognition Service Awards (Rev. 2/18/25)

- (a) The county believes that a program to recognize county employees who make significant contributions and demonstrate their commitment during the performance of their duties result in higher morale and productivity among all employees and permit the county to fulfill its statutory responsibilities in an efficient and cost-effective manner thereby serving a public purpose. Minnesota Statute 15.46 allows for County Boards to establish employee recognition and wellness programs.
- (b) Eligibility: All regular, full-time and regular, part-time employees. Seasonal and temporary employees are not eligible for bonus payments.
