MINUTES FROM THE JANUARY 14, 2024 REGULAR BOARD MEETING

Chairperson Buchholz called the Thursday, January 14, 2024 meeting to order at 8:30 a.m.

The meeting was held in person at the Historic Courthouse at 215 1st Ave, S, Long Prairie, MN 56347.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Call for Introductions.

Board members present in person were: Leland Buchholz, Wayne Wendel, Dale Katterhagen, Barb James and Tom Williamson.

Others present in person were: Deja Anton, District Manager, Adam Ossefoort, Division Director, Sarah Katterhagen, Program Coordinator, Tim Ebnet, Conservation Technician, Dylan Pratt, Conservation Technician, Josh Votruba, Conservation Technician, Kasen Christiansen, Conservation Technician, Luke Thoma, NRCS, Barb Becker, Todd County Commissioner, and Randy Neumann, Todd County Commissioner and Darren Mayers, BWSR.

Buchholz asked if there were any additions or corrections to the agenda. Katterhagen made a motion, seconded by Wendel to accept the revised agenda for the regular January 14, 2024 meeting.

Affirmative: Buchholz, Wendel, Katterhagen, James and Williamson. Motion Carried.

Williamson made a motion, seconded by Wendel to approve minutes as disbursed from the December 14, 2023 board meeting. Affirmative: Buchholz, Wendel, Katterhagen, James and Williamson. Motion Carried.

Buchholz asked the board to review December's 2023 Treasurer's Report. Wendel made a motion, seconded by Williamson to accept December's 2023 Treasurer's Report with receipts totaling \$425,914.70 and disbursements totaling \$239,734.62. Affirmative: Buchholz, Wendel, Katterhagen, James and Williamson. Motion Carried.

Buchholz called for conflict of interest. No conflict of interest was reported.

REPORTS:

Commissioner's Report: Commissioner Becker reported the roofing project is completed, and the County will start working on the Solid Waste project. Commissioner Neumann reported the County received a grant for the rock wall project.

The Commissioners also reported they have been receiving a lot of calls regarding Dairy Ridge's expansion and land application concerns. Also calls regarding updating the Feedlot Ordinance.

Commissioner's expressed concern, why staff haven't followed up on the land application concerns the County has been receiving.

Anton reported they received one call and the caller didn't release his/her name. Per complaint policy, the caller needs to leave their name for the County to respond.

Becker stated she would like to see the SWCD Planning Commission Liaison sit up with the Planning Commission Board like Commissioner Denny.

Ossefoort reported due to the set up of the meeting, there wasn't any additional room at the table.

James reported the Public needs to know the proposed changes to the County Feedlot Ordinance.

Ossefoort reported he will be attending the County Commissioner work session to discuss the next steps for the Feedlot Ordinance revisions, discussing if there should be informative meetings, discussing if educational events should be held and if a task force committee should be formed.

Katterhagen asked if there is a timeline for updating the Feedlot Ordinance.

Ossefoort reported in depends on the complexity of the changes.

Becker reported the people need to understand they are not changing zoning, just the feedlot ordinance.

Anton reported people are fearing larger setbacks and capping sites.

Buchholz stated when presenting to the public, the terminology used needs to be clear to the general public.

Wendel noted at the Planning Commission meeting, there should have been a discussion on the purpose and intentions of updating the Feedlot Ordinance.

Director Update: Ossefoort reported the recent Planning Commission meeting had a large attendance. He will be bringing the Feedlot Ordinance discussion to a County Commissioner work session and is working on the February Planning Commission agenda. Ossefoort reported he attended a Planning and Zoning Administrator meeting and the application for CWP loan funds was approved.

Katterhagen mentioned that he thought that Jim Pratt ran a good Planning Commission meeting.

SWCD Manager's Report: See handout from District Manager. Forestry and Easement workload has picked up.

Anton reported that the Board of Supervisors nominated Sarah Katterhagen for the BWSR Employee of the Year Award. S. Katterhagen was recognized by District Manager and Board of Supervisors during the meeting.

1W1P Long Prairie Report: The next policy meeting will be on January 18, 2024 and the group submitted the Supplemental Request application for additional funding.

1W1P Crow Wing Report: The Crow Wing Watershed partners are working on determining priority regions.

1W1P Mississippi Brainerd Report: BWSR approved the Watershed Plan and will be having a policy meeting on January 23, 2024.

BWSR Report: Mayers did a quick PowerPoint presentation overview on what the SWCD Supervisor training will be about on February 13, 2024.

RESOLUTION TO ADOPT AND IMPLEMENT THE SAUK RIVER COMPREHENSIVE WATERSHED MANAGEMENT PLAN 2024-25 BIENNIAL WORKPLAN

WHEREAS, Todd Soil and Water Conservation District (SWCD) adopted the Sauk River Comprehensive Watershed Management Plan (CWMP) for the area of the county identified within the Sauk River Watershed

WHEREAS, the Sauk River CWMP called for the development and adoption of biennial work plans, to be completed by a Policy Committee established via the execution of a joint powers collaborative agreement amongst partnering entities implementing the Sauk River CWMP, and

WHEREAS, Todd SWCD has received notice from said Policy Committee that: 1) the 2024-25 Biennial Work Plan has been reviewed and 2) the Policy Committee recommends approval of the same by each collaborative member's governing board.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, Todd SWCD hereby adopts and will begin implementation of the Sauk River CWMP 2024-25 Biennial Work Plan.





Grant Title: 2024 - CRP State Incentives Pilot Program (Stearns County Grant Agreement P24-0715)

Grant Award: \$30,000

Activity Category: Agricultural Practices

Description: The staff will target priority areas in the Sauk River Comprehensive Watershed Management Plan (CWMP). CCRP enrollment and re-enrollment in CWMP priority areas with up to \$100 per acre on first come, first serve with a maximum payout of \$3,000 per contract.

In the targeted Getchell Creek Project Area, CCRP acres enrolling cropland acres, up to \$500 per acre and/or CCRP enrollment and re-enrollment for non-cropland acres, up to \$100 per acre on first come, first serve first-serve with a maximum payout of \$3,000 per contract.

Eligible practices will include all CCRP practices. All practices must be consistent with USDA NRCS FOTG or be a professionally accepted engineered practice. Staff with the required Job Approval Authority (JAA) will have signing authority for the conservation plans and contracts.

Landowners will be eligible for the incentive payment upon receipt of a Notice of Contract Approval from the Farm Service Agency (FSA).

10% of the budget can and will be set-aside for Administration of the grant.

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

This agreement (Agreement) is made and entered into between:

The Counties of Aitkin, Crow Wing, Todd, and Morrison by and through their respective County Board of Commissioners, and

The Aitkin, Crow Wing, Todd, and Morrison Soil and Water Conservation Districts, by and through their respective Soil and Water Conservation District Board of Supervisors Collectively referred to as the "Parties."

WHEREAS, the Counties of this Agreement are political subdivisions of the State of Minnesota, with authority to carry out environmental programs and land use controls, pursuant to Minnesota Statutes Chapter 375 and as otherwise provided by law; and

WHEREAS, the Soil and Water Conservation Districts (SWCDs) of this Agreement are political subdivisions of the State of Minnesota, with statutory authority to carry out erosion control and other soil and water conservation programs, pursuant to Minnesota Statutes Chapter 103C and as otherwise provided by law; and

WHEREAS, the Parties to this Agreement have a common interest and statutory authority to assure implementation of a comprehensive watershed management plan in the Mississippi River-Brainerd Watershed to conserve soil and water resources through the practices, programs, and regulatory controls that effectively control or prevent erosion, sedimentation, siltation and related pollution in order to preserve natural resources, ensure continued soil productivity, protect water quality, reduce damages caused by floods, preserve wildlife, protect the tax base, and protect public lands and waters; and

WHEREAS, with matters that relate to the coordination of water management authorities pursuant to Minnesota Statutes Chapters 103B,103C, and 103D with public drainage systems pursuant to Minnesota Statutes Chapters 103E, this Agreement does not change the rights or obligations of the public drainage system authorities.

WHEREAS, the Parties have formed this Agreement for the specific goal of implementing the Mississippi River-Brainerd Comprehensive Watershed Management Plan, which was developed pursuant to Minnesota Statutes § 103B.801, Comprehensive Watershed Management Planning, also known as *One Watershed, One Plan*.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Parties hereto agree as follows:

- 1. **Purpose:** The Parties to this Agreement recognize the importance of partnerships to plan and implement protection and restoration efforts for the Mississippi River-Brainerd Watershed (See Attachment A: Implementation Area Map). The purpose of this Agreement is to collectively implement, as local government units, the Mississippi River-Brainerd Comprehensive Watershed Management Plan per the provision of the Plan. Parties signing this agreement will be collectively referred to as the Mississippi River-Brainerd Watershed Collaboration. The "Mississippi River-Brainerd Comprehensive Watershed Management Plan Implementation Committee" and are partnering together in this Agreement as an exercise of joint powers under Minn. Stat. Section 471.59.
- 2. **Term:** This Agreement is effective upon signature of all Parties in consideration of the Board of Water and Soil Resources (BWSR) Participation Requirements for participation in Watershed Based Implementation Funding; and will remain in effect until cancelled according to the provisions of this Agreement, unless

earlier terminated by law. This Agreement end date will run concurrent with the BWSR grant agreement end date of December 2033. Parties may revisit the grant agreement end date and make extensions to the term of the grant agreement if agreed upon by the Policy Committee (the structure, membership, and governing provisions of the Policy Committee are described in a later paragraph in this Agreement).

- 3. Adding Additional Parties: A qualifying party within the Mississippi River-Brainerd Watershed that is responsible for water planning and resource management according to Minnesota State Statutes desiring to become a member of this Agreement shall indicate its intent by adoption of a governing board resolution. The Resolution shall be mailed to the existing Policy Committee, and upon receipt by the Policy Committee, the qualifying party shall become a member of the Policy Committee. The qualifying party agrees to abide by the terms and conditions of this Agreement, including but not limited to the bylaws, policies and procedures adopted by the Policy Committee.
- 4. **Withdrawal of Parties:** A party desiring to leave this Agreement shall indicate its intent in writing to the Policy Committee in the form of an official board resolution. Notice must be made at least 30 days in advance of leaving the Agreement.

5. General Provisions:

- a. **Compliance with Laws/Standards**: The Parties agree to abide by all federal, state, and local laws; statutes, ordinances, rules, and regulations now in effect or hereafter adopted pertaining to this Agreement or to the facilities, programs, and staff for which the Agreement is responsible. All Parties to this Agreement will be given the option to opt out within 30 days after new federal, state or local laws, statutes, ordinances, rules, and regulations are adopted and become effective, which increase or decrease the responsibilities of the Parties pertaining to this Agreement.
- b. Indemnification: Each party to this Agreement shall be liable for the acts of its officers, employees or agents and the results thereof to the extent authorized or limited by law and shall not be responsible for the acts of any other party, its officers, employees, or agents. The provisions of the Municipal Tort Claims Act, Minnesota Statute Chapter 466, and other applicable laws govern the liability of the Parties. To the full extent permitted by law, actions by the Parties, their respective officers, employees and agents, pursuant to this Agreement, are intended to be and shall be construed as a "cooperative activity". It is the intent of the Parties that they shall be deemed a "single governmental unit" for the purpose of liability, as set forth in Minnesota Statutes § 471.59, subd. 1a(a). For purposes of Minnesota Statutes § 471.59, subd. 1a(a) it is the intent of each party that this Agreement does not create any liability or exposure of one party for the acts or omissions of any other party.
- c. Records Retention and Data Practices: The Parties agree that records created pursuant to the terms of this Agreement will be retained in a manner that meets their respective entity's records retention schedules that have been reviewed and approved by the State in accordance with Minnesota Statutes §138.17. The Parties further agree that records prepared or maintained in furtherance of the Agreement shall be subject to the Minnesota Government Data Practices Act. At the time this Agreement expires, all records will be turned over to Aitkin Soil and Water Conservation District for continued retention.
- d. **Timeliness:** The Parties agree to perform obligations under this Agreement in a timely manner and keep each other informed about any delays that may occur.
- e. **Termination:** The Parties anticipate that this Agreement will remain in full force and effect through the term of the grant agreement with BWSR, unless otherwise terminated in accordance with law or

- other provisions of this Agreement. The Parties acknowledge their respective and applicable obligations, if any, under Minnesota Statute §471.59, Subd. 5 after the purpose of the Agreement has been completed.
- f. **Extension:** The Parties may extend the termination date of this Agreement for the purposes of implementation the plan beyond the BWSR grant planning phase identified in Section 2 as agreed upon unanimously by the Parties to this Agreement.

6. Administration:

- a. Establishment of a Policy Committee and Advisory Committee for Implementation of the Mississippi River-Brainerd Comprehensive Water Management Plan. The Parties hereto agree to designate one representative, who must be an elected or appointed member of their governing board, to a Policy Committee for implementation of the Mississippi-River Brainerd Comprehensive Water Management Plan. The Policy Committee will meet as needed to implement and decide on the content of the work plan.
 - i. Each representative shall have one vote and shall have the authority to act on behalf of their Board mentioned items, grant agreement(s) and amendment(s), interim report review and approval, payments under the grant, professional contracts, and voting on the recommended work plan.
 - ii. The Policy Committee member will serve as a liaison to their respective boards. Each governing board may choose one alternate to serve on the Policy Committee as needed in the absence of the designated member.
 - iii. An Advisory Committee will be established to provide technical support on the plan content and Implementation to the Policy Committee, including identification of priorities. The Advisory Committee will comprise the Steering Committee, stakeholders, the state's main water agencies, and/or plan review agencies. The Advisory Committee will as needed.
 - iv. A Steering Committee will be established consisting of local staff, county staff, and SWCD staff for the purposes of logistical and day-to-day decision-making in the Implementation process. The Steering Committee will meet as needed.
- 7. Fiscal Agent: Aitkin Soil and Water Conservation District will act as the fiscal agent for the purposes of this Agreement and agrees to:
 - Accept all responsibilities associated with implementing the BWSR grant agreement for developing a watershed-based implementation plan and sign the grant agreement on behalf of the Parties listed within.
 - b. Perform financial transactions as part of the grant agreement and contract implementation.
 - c. Pursuant to Minn. Stat. Section 471.59, Subd. 3, strict accountability of all funds and report of all receipts and disbursements and annually provide a full and complete audit report.
 - d. Responsible for fiscal records retention consistent with the agent's records retention schedule.
- 8. Grant Administration: Aitkin Soil and Water Conservation District will act as the grant administrator for the purposes of this Agreement and agrees to provide the following services:

- a. Accept all day-to-day responsibilities associated with implementing the BWSR grant agreement for watershed-based implementation grant funds.
- b. Provide the Policy Committee with the records necessary to describe the financial condition of the BWSR grant agreement.
- c. Be the Day-to-Day Contact for the Mississippi River-Brainerd Comprehensive Water Management Implementation Plan.
- d. Responsible for the BWSR reporting requirements (E-link).
- 9. The Todd Soil and Water Conservation District agrees to provide the following services for this Agreement and agrees to:
 - a. Provide a note-taker for all Policy, Advisory, and Steering Committee meetings. Prepare and distribute those notes to the appropriate committees.
- 10. The Crow Wing Soil and Water Conservation District agrees to provide the following services for this Agreement and agrees to:
 - Assist the Chair of the Policy Committee with providing an agenda for upcoming meetings.
 - b. Notify all committees of upcoming meetings through email and/or phone calls.
 - c. May, with the Agreement and consent of the Fiscal Agent, assign any of the foregoing services to the Fiscal Agent who shall perform the services it accepts.
 - 11. The following Parties agree to provide the following services:
 - a. Grant Administration/Fiscal Agent: Aitkin Soil and Water Conservation District
 - b. Policy and Advisory Committee Coordination: Crow Wing Soil and Water Conservation District

In the event of a vacancy in the above-listed roles, the party responsible for the role will determine if there is adequate capacity within the organization to fulfill the listed role. If the partner agency determines it, they no longer have capacity and would like to relinquish their duties, they must inform the Steering Committee. The Steering Committee will then reassign the service to another party with the capacity to fulfill the grant agreement.



Todd SWCD Seeks Nominees for the 2024 Conservationist <u>Award</u>

Purpose: The Minnesota Association of Soil and Water Conservation Districts (MASWCD), with support from *The Farmer* magazine, offers the MASWCD Outstanding Conservationist Award to recognize individuals, conservation organizations, and others for outstanding accomplishments with implementing conservation practices and improving Minnesota's natural resources. Recognition will be given for accomplishments **between July 1 of last year and June 30 of this year**.

And the 2024 SWCD Land Stewardship Award

Purpose: Recognize organization or individual that has contributed significantly toward implementing conservation programs or education efforts with the purpose of the recognition to show appreciation, bring attention to their efforts, and model their efforts for others.

Staff have put together these nominations for the Board to consider in March. Please let your District Manager know if you would like other individuals or groups added to this nominee list.

Candidate 1: This family resides in Leslie Township where they raise beef cattle, crop farm and own a trucking company. This landowner has worked with the SWCD on many projects in the past including: relocating a feedlot in order to protect surface water quality, building of a Stacking Slab and a VTA on the new feedlot in order to control runoff from the feedlot, installing a travel lane and access control to prevent the cattle from entering surface waters. In 2023, this landowner installed an alternative waterer with Heavy Use Area Protection (HUAP) to limit the effect of the cattle on a nearby drainage ditch. This landowner has also participated in the 2017 local farm conservation tour where they led much of the discussion. They are also Minnesota Ag Water Quality certified and very involved in the Todd County Farm Bureau. This is a multi-generation farm. This landowner began his work as a very anti- government customer. The family resides in Bruce Township where they raise beef cattle in lots and pasture as well as raise crops. This landowner has worked with Todd SWCD to work on installing runoff diversions, curbs, sediment catch basins, and a vegetative treatment area. In 2023, the landowner worked with the SWCD on cover crops, wetland ditching, and is working with Tim with interest in becoming Ag Water Quality certified. This landowner and his son served on the Mississippi- Brainerd Citizens Committee as well as hosted the 2023 Todd SWCD Local Work Group Tour and lunch. This is a multi-generation farm. Candidate #3) This is another family which is "growing" into conservation- also previously having an anti-government position. The family resides in Reynolds

Township and has worked with Todd SWCD on pit closures, heavy use protection, a roofed stacking slab,

new LMSAs, and has worked with the AG BMP program for many farm related upgrades. Most recently, they have started experimenting with cover crops. This family is a multi-generation dairy farm.

Candidate #4 This family is a multi-generation dairy and beef farm in Northwestern Todd County. They have completed two pit closures with Todd SWCD and most recently installed an irrigation sensor in 2023. They are multigenerational farmers and the wife is an Ag instructor at a local high school.

Candidate 5: This individual is a landowner located in Todd County that originally grew up on a dairy farm. He and his wife are very interested in protecting open spaces from residential and commercial development. Recently, he has worked with the USFWS to restore approximately 23 acres of drained and degraded wetland habitat across 7 wetland basins located on private land within Todd County. He is currently working with the SWCD to enroll land in a Reinvest in Minnesota (RIM) Working Lands Easement for 477 acres which entails utilizing a prescribed grazing plan from the NRCS. Of his 500 acres privately owned, he has 158 acres enrolled within a Forest Stewardship Plan (FSP).

Candidate #6: This family is from Germania TWP with a long history of both dairy and beef farming on large acreage pasture. Currently, they rent their pastures to a local beef farmer. They have worked with the SWCD in one pit closure and one cattle crossing, completed in 2023. They have also been spot- lighted by BWSR on the BWSR Facebook page, were interviewed, and did a video on their pit closure project on the Partridge River. In 2023, they welcomed the Crow Wing 1W1P Bus Tour to their farm. They are actively involved in Ducks Unlimited and Pheasants Forever. The middle generation (husband and wife) both work in law enforcement. This is a multi-generation farm.

Candidate #7:

This is an organization that owns recreational property on Fairy Lake. This group has worked with the DNR on buckthorn control, USFWS on establishing native prairie and Oak Savanna plantings on their property, and is currently working on developing a plan to restore native wetland habitat. They developed an easement with the Fairy Lakes Association to install an SWCD outlet project reducing erosion to Ashley Creek and to the shores of Fairy Lake. The project was fully completed in 2023. Also in 2023, they assisted the DNR and Public Works on a culvert repair on HWY 11 by providing fill. They participate in the Fairy Lake Association meetings and education events, and are proposing the construction of an educational boardwalk along the wetland to educate the public and area youth on the ecology and benefits of wetlands and clean water. This will hopefully be provided through the state "No Child Left Inside" program along with partnership of Todd SWCD. They also participate in many other community events and fundraisers. They donated funds (and the land) for the Fairy Lake Outlet project in 2023.

Candidate #8 This combined organization in Birchdale TWP is working on its second year of co-hosting a shoreland education event with Todd SWCD. This group has also monitored Prairie Creek for pollutants such as P, E coli, and sediment as it dumps in Little Birch Lake. They are working with Sauk River Watershed to install riffles for fish at the lake outlet. Together in 2023, this organization came up with the idea of supplying four area bait shops with bait bags printed with educational messages pertaining to AIS on the outside; the bag recognizes both lakes and Todd SWCD as funders of this idea. There are 22 volunteer residents who host learning events to other area lakes on aquatic plant identification. These volunteers monitor the shores monthly for invasives. This group also works with Dairy Ridge, the Ahrens Family farm, and township officials to improve water quality. They are willing to offer match dollars to a gully erosion project on Little Birch Lake in 2024 if it goes through.

This group also has offered cost-share to farmers if they would keep their buffers on private ditches. They have strong representation on the Todd County AIS Committee.

This candidate and his wife have a cabin on Lake Beauty in Bruce TWP. They have maintained an excellent functioning rain garden for close to a decade, now. In 2022, with the help of the SWCD, they installed a lawn to legumes planting to promote Rusty Patch Bumble Bee habitat, and completed a buffer planting in 2023 with Todd SWCD technicians. This couple was a member of the Mississippi_ Brainerd Citizens Committee in 2023, Lake Beauty Lake Association, and has been promoting riparian habitat along the shores of Lake Beauty for years.

Candidate # 10. This couple lives in Burnhamville TWP. The husband works on the Board of Adjustment for Todd County. He has planted many acres of early establishment forest, food plots, and pollinator plantings interspersed with farm ground. This couple has established the most successful rain garden in Todd County, They manage a healthy riparian forest on the shores of Bass Lake. The couple traveled back and forth from their home to Brainerd as a member of the Technical Committee for the Brainerd_ Mississippi 1W1P Plan. They also hosted the 2023 Local Work Group tour welcoming the group to their property and giving a presentation-- just to scratch the surface of this couple's contributions to conservation of natural resources.
