NRCS Report: Thoma reported Josh Hanson will be acting Area Conservationist for the next few months, NRCS has one EQIP application left to obligate, and a lot of landowner interest in cover crops and irrigation.

1W1P Long Prairie Report: Katterhagen reported that Todd SWCD presented on a cover crop project at the policy meeting. Ossefoort added the CRP incentive grant work plan will be submitted soon.

1W1P Crow Wing Report: Wendel reported he attended a meeting on July 24th. The public comment period is open on the plan. The plan will be presented to BWSR in December or January.

1W1P Mississippi Brainerd Report: Implementation funding is available for projects. **BWSR Report:** No report.





Background: This wetland complex is located on private land owned by Thomas and Kimberly Egan within Wykeham Township, 1.2 miles south of Grace Lake, 1.5 miles West of Eagle Creek, and within close proximity to intermittent streams. The Long Prairie One Watershed, One Plan (LPR1W1P), focuses the location as "tier 1" regarding prioritization of work areas based on plan goals. Within the LPR1W1P, the Todd SWCD/partners are responsible for actions such as Storage Practices (i.e. wetland restoration, floodplain restoration, and cover crops) as a primary goal through the entire implementation timeline. Through the 10yr duration, the output is estimated to be 555 acre-feet with an estimation of \$32,918 annual cost.

Proposal: This project will restore approximately 7.5 acres of drained seasonal wetland habitat located on private land in Todd County, Minnesota. The Sunderman property lies within a wetland complex with direct connectivity to Big Sauk Lake. The Sundermans have worked with Todd SWCD in the past to exclude animals from the wetland complexes when pasturing. Currently the SW corner of the south lot lies within 30 feet of a seasonally flooded basin. The two northern lots drain north to pasture serving as a compliant filter. This year the Sundermans have noted with the extreme weather that their lot is discharging. They have worked with WCTSA to develop a low cost fix plan which MINNFARMs out to compliance. They will construct a heavy use pad of about 2,000 sq. feet to get the cattle off the lower ground and for easier cleaning/manure handling. The lots will be reshaped; an earthen diversion berm will be constructed to divert runoff to a 5'x50' filter area. A second berm will be constructed to prevent excess runoff from reaching the wetland. The lots will reach compliance after the fix. The farm is registered for 52 animal units with the majority of the cow-calf pairs remaining in pasture. This is the type of project perfect for Performance funds- s small farm requiring not a ton of engineering to get improved results. This is in a priority area of the Sauk River One Watershed, One Plan.

The staff will focus on the entire area covered by the Sauk River Comprehensive Watershed Management Plan (CWMP). CCRP enrollment and re-enrollment in CWMP areas with up to \$100 per acre on first come, first serve with a maximum payout of \$3,000 per contract.

The staff will target priority areas in the Sauk River Comprehensive Watershed Management Plan (CWMP). CCRP enrollment and re-enrollment in CWMP areas with up to \$500 per acre on first come, first serve with a maximum payout of \$15,000 per contract.

Eligible practices will include all CCRP practices. All practices must be consistent with USDA NRCS FOTG or be a professionally accepted engineered practice. Staff with the required Job Approval Authority (JAA) will have signing authority for the conservation plans and contracts.

Landowners will be eligible for the incentive payment upon receipt of a Notice of Contract Approval from the Farm Service Agency (FSA).

10% of the budget can and will be set-aside for Administration of the grant.

This collaborative process is built on the SWCD's history of tree seedling sales and forestry cost share projects with MN DNR. Through these efforts, we have developed long-term working relationships with the MN DNR's Private Forest Management (PFM) Program and local consultants.
