Commissioner's Report: No Report.

Reports:

Supervisor Buchholz Update: Buchholz added that he has been asked to serve on the MASWCD Nomination committee.

Director Update: Ossefoort reported the Commissioners voided the class comp study with Gallagher. Gallagher now has 60 days to make changes to the report. The preliminary budget is due in a few weeks. The Rock Wall project is in progress, and the County removed the homes on the lots they recently bought to make more parking. Ossefoort also reported the Drinking Water Grant was executed. The digester request was recommended for approval to the Board Commissioners by the Planning Commission. The county will be reviewing cannabis ordinance and the county is looking at utilizing Region 5 for a County wide comp study review.

The SWCD board would like to have board representation during the comp study review.

SWCD Manger's Report: See Manger's written report for specific details. Anton reported she submitted a CWF grant application for Big Swan Lake for a alum treatment, working on easement requests, completed award write up for the award winners with assistance from Christiansen and Scheve. Anton also reported she attended a fall Swan Lake Association meeting with Ossefoort, met with Public Works on erosion projects and met with Birchdale Township on erosion projects. Anton also is preparing for Pheasant Forever interviews and working with BWSR on proposing changes to feedlot caps on grant funding.

James entered the meeting at 8:52 a.m.

Anton reported on September 9, 2024 she met with Ossefoort and Bauer the County Coordinator regarding the County's 605 budget. The 605 budget is where County staff that work on SWCD programs are budgeted for payroll, benefits, training, phone, and other miscellaneous items. Anton mailed a written summary of the meeting to the Board of Supervisors. The meeting was held per the request the County Coordinator and the County Finance Committee. During the meeting on September 9, 2024 there was miscommunication on how staff payroll and benefits are divided out between two different budgets. The Program Coordinator is 75% out of 605 (SWCD payroll +other items) budget and 25% out of 105 (P&Z) budget. Ossefoort is 50/50 from 605 (SWCD payroll +other items) budget and 105 (P&Z) budget. Ossefoort will be correcting his statement with the County Coordinator as he misspoke during the meeting on September 9, 2024.

Anton suggested during the November work session the SWCD Board of Supervisors review the Agreement with the County.

Anton stated the County is keeping all the interest on Soil and Water grants funds, which could calculate to thousands and thousands of dollars.

SWCD Staff Report: Anton reported Votruba is working RIM inspections and finished up the Dreher project.

Anton reported Christiansen has been attending trainings, working with landowners on ditch cleanings, currently no wetland violations and completed ob well readings for August. Anton informed the board there has been some changes to the wetland rules.

Anton reported Scheve has been shadowing staff with sites visits and has been attending trainings.

Anton reported Ebnet has been busy with Nutrient Management plans, Ag Water Certifications, Cover Crops and other conservation projects.

Anton reported Pratt has been busy with feedlot inspections.

Anton reported S. Katterhagen has been busy planning for Enviro Fest.

Staff Visual Report: Pratt presented his visual staff report which highlighted pit closure projects and feedlot fix projects that he has been part of the last few months.

NRCS Report: Thoma reported round #1 of EQIP closed and they received between 50-60 applications. NRCS is also looking at filing a Soil Conservation position and he will be assisting in the Pheasants Forever interviews. NRCS is also looking for volunteers for the office or for the field who want to build their resume.

1W1P SRWD Report: Williamson attended a policy meeting on July 13th and the next round of funding grant agreement was executed.

1W1P Red Eye Report: No meetings.

1W1P Long Prairie Report: No meetings and the meeting for September was canceled.

1W1P Crow Wing Report: On September 24, 2024 the public comment period will close. There will be a meeting on October 27, 2024. The plan will go to BWSR in December or January depending on BWSR's meeting schedule.

1W1P Mississippi Brainerd Report: No update.

BWSR Report: Mayers reported BWSR Academy registration will open on Monday, September 16, 2024. Crow Wing is having a bus tour on September 26, 2024 and Morrison SWCD is hosting a field day on October 11, 2024.

Celebration: Todd SWCD was mentioned in article about Nathan and Samantha Middendorf for being hosts of the Catholic Century Farm award and how Samantha received the Teacher of the Year Award from Todd SWCD.

The grant agreement for P25-0558 2025 Soil Health Delivery Grant in the amount of \$80,000 was signed by Ossefoort. Anton informed the board \$53,000 out of the \$80,000 was assigned to cost share projects and for this meeting more than that amount will be encumbered if all the requests are approved. The board decided to adjust the budget in order to encumber all project requests, so the landowners can move forward.



Resource Concern and Project Purpose Description

The resource concern is mainly groundwater, wetland complex habitat protection, and feedlot watershed runoff with connectivity to Freeman's Creek, a tributary of the Long Prairie River. This was the location of a substantial feedlot/manure violation prior to Joe purchasing this site. This site has been significantly cleaned up but to meet compliance, the site still needs the pit upgraded, lot runoff controls added, improvements to waste transfer, and silage runoff collection and treatment. The existing pit will be upgraded to current standards, a second pit will be added to collect silage and north lot runoff, and transfer pipes and scrape lanes for waste transfer will be drawn into the plan for more efficient waste handling. This is one of the Big 3 Feedlot remaining environmental concerns in Todd County to be fixed. Joe has been on the cost-share list since 2017, and has finally received funding. Wells south of the farm have High Nitrates due to prior land abuse in the violation period.





A conservation concern is loss of wetlands and/or restoration of wetlands. This subsection had thousands of acres of wetlands before settlement that were heavily used by waterfowl. Waterfowl numbers are very low presently, so a major emphasis is to restore their habitat.

This land is primarily made up of river bottom soils and floodplains. Many of the floodplains were filled in by humans up to the 1970's. Loss of floodplains means harsher flooding along other areas of the river since the floodplains are no longer existent to take soak and slow excessive water and ice melt.

Objective: Manage this wetland cover type as a wetland habitat for waterfowl and furbearers.





Interesting Factoids

Deer population too high while 44 of the 65 species of migrant bird species that nest in these forests have reductions in populations. Both of these are likely due to fragmented forests for land use development and forest loss due to agriculture.

One uncommon bird that exists in this habitat is the Nelson's Sparrow, and is defined as a Species in Greatest Conservation Need:



There are woodland prairies on this property. Species include goldenrod, Kentucky bluegrass, milkweed, aster, wild strawberries and raspberries. Also gooseberry and leatherwood shrubs exist which indicate rich and fertile soil for growing trees. Meadow rue, bloodroot, ginger, moss and trillium cover the forest floor

Kandota soils grow excellent red pine stands that are easily established. Can mix with oak, basswood, and maple. If not planting to trees, leave as native brush, grasses, and wildflowers.

Other deciduous trees found include Burr Oak, Ironwood, Box elder, Aspen, and Elm.

Sadly, the large volume of buckthorn is ruining the diversity and wildlife value of this forest.


This covertype is found throughout a majority of the property and is in the transition period of the MHc26 plant community. The overstory is comprised of red oak and bur oak



with a good mixture of red maple, basswood, ash, aspen and birch. Ironwood, ash, and buckthorn were the dominant understory vegetation. Some areas were once pastured which resulted in areas of lower overstory stocking and more ironwood or buckthorn. Other shrubs in the covertype were hazelnut, nannyberry, hawthorn, grey dogwood, prickly ash and chokecherry. There is scattered ash, oak, aspen and basswood seedlings understory and the ground forbs are typical of the MHc26 plant community. The scattered buckthorn shrubs should be removed.

The production of acorns in this stand is important for wildlife forage during the late fall and early winter. Because of the amount of tannins in red oak acorns, they are too bitter to eat when

they first fall off the tree. Water and melting snow washes the tannic acid away causing the acorn to become less bitter in taste. Thus, red oak acoms provide mast in the late fall, early winter and even the spring. On the contrary, bur oak acorns do not have high amounts of tannins. These acoms are much sweeter and are usually eaten right away.



A vulnerable bird that makes this habitat its home in summer months is the Purple Martin.



Tree species- burr oak, red oak, basswood, green ash- all very timber harvestable.

Groundcover: The ground cover consists of grass, bracken fern, lady fern, Clayton's sweet cicely, Strawberry, aster, goldenrod, shepherd's purse, Solomon's seal, meadow rue, and a few other broadleaf plants common in woods.

Buckthorn and overly mature trees threaten the native wildlife diversity on this property.

Management: In light of the potential for emerald ash borer infestation, the merchantable green ash timber should be harvested whenever other timber harvesting is done on your property. In addition, also harvest all of the basswood before it gets too large and hollows out.






