Wendel asked the board to review April 2025 Treasurer's Report. Katterhagen made a motion, seconded by James to accept April's 2025 Treasurer's Report with receipts totaling \$8,903.03 and disbursements totaling \$21,627.15 Affirmative: Wendel, Katterhagen, James, Williamson and Bebus. Motion Carried.

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Special Guest Don Bajumpaa from BWSR: Bajumpaa completed Organization Assessment for Todd Soil and Water Conservation District and for Todd County Planning and Zoning. Bajumpaa provided an overview of the draft report. The board was mailed a copy of the draft report after the meeting. See the report for more details.

Bajumpaa informed the board that BWSR has grants available if the SWCD would like to do a workload analysis.

Commissioner's Report: On behalf of the Commissioner's Bauer reminded the board the Todd County Comp Plan is being updated and encouraged the board to completed the survey if they haven't already.

Director Report: Ossefoort reported Todd County hosted three kick off meetings for the Todd County Comp plan, looking at incorporating the Watershed plans into the County Comp plan and will be starting budgeting process for 2026. Ossefoort informed the SWCD board Commissioner Denny wanted the board to know the Commissioners' are continuing to watch for budget updates from the State.

SWCD Manager Report: No report.

Christiansen Celebration: Christiansen shared with the board that his family welcomed their first baby.

BWSR Report: Mayers reported the NRCS RCPP Soil Health funding is still pending approval. Competitive grant applications may go to every other year in the future. Mayers reminded the board to check if they have any grants expiring.

Crow Wing River Watershed Implementation Fiscal Agent Agreement

This Agreement is made and entered into between the Crow Wing Soil and Water Conservation District (SWCD) as Fiscal Agent for the Board of Water and Soil Resources Watershed Base implementation Grant Funding and those members of the Crow Wing River Comprehensive Watershed Management Plan Implementation Agreement (also referred to herein as the "CWRIA") who desire access to funds granted to the CWRIA and who have entered into this Agreement.

RECITALS:

WHEREAS, the parties are political subdivisions of the State of Minnesota, with statutory authority to carry out environmental programs in accordance with Minnesota Statutes Sections 103B, 103C, 103D, 103E, 375, and as otherwise provided by law; and

WHEREAS, Minnesota Statute §471.59 allows the parties to jointly exercise powers common among them and provides for one or more of the parties to exercise powers on behalf of the participating collaborative parties; and

WHEREAS, Minnesota Statute §103B.101 provides for the adoption of a comprehensive watershed management plan also known as the "One Watershed, One Plan" (hereafter "IWIP"), which requires the collaborative parties to coordinate with each other to maximize available resources and minimize duplication of services; and

WHEREAS, in 2025 (year), the above Parties adopted the Crow Wing River Comprehensive Watershed Management Plan (according to Minnesota (Minn) Statue (Stat.) §103B.231) and a Minn. Stat. §471.59 Joint Powers Collaborative Agreement to implement the plan through the Crow Wing River Comprehensive Watershed Management Plan Implementation Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the collaborative parties desire to enter into this Agreement to allow the collaborative to appoint a fiscal agent to administer the Board of Soil and Water Resources' (BWSR) Watershed-Based Implementation Funding Grants and other funding and grants received by Crow Wing SWCD on behalf of the CWRIA.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual benefits that each party shall derive from this Agreement, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. Purpose. The Parties have entered into this Agreement for the purpose of designating Crow Wing SWCD to serve as Fiscal Agent for the CWRIA in relation to the Watershed-Based Implementation Funding Grants ("WBIF Grants") and for all other funding and grants received by Crow Wing SWCD (hereinafter "Fiscal Agent") on behalf of the CWRIA. This Agreement does not apply to grant funds awarded directly to Crow Wing SWCD on its own behalf.
- **2. Term.** The Term of this Agreement shall be from the Effective Date as of April 02, 2025, notwithstanding the dates of the signatures of the parties. It shall continue until this Agreement is terminated as provided in this Agreement.

3. General Provisions:

- a. **Compliance with Laws/Standards.** The parties agree to abide by all Federal, State, or local laws, statutes, ordinances, rules, and regulations now in effect or hereafter adopted pertaining to this Agreement.
 - b. Compliance with CWRIA Agreement. The parties agree to abide by the terms contained in the CWRIA Agreement signed by the Parties from December 2024 through January 2025, as may be amended, and incorporated herein.
 - c. **Liability.** The Parties agree that each is independently responsible for complying with this Agreement, the WBIF Grant Agreements, other grants and funding agreements entered into on behalf of the

CWRIA, and the statutes, rules, and regulations which govern the Parties 1W1P. No Party will be liable for any violation of any provision of applicable laws or the terms of this Agreement indirectly or directly arising out of, resulting from, or in any manner attributable to, actions of any other Party or its employees, contractors, and agents. The Parties do not intend to waive any immunities, defenses or limitations of liability available to the Parties at law or in equity and the Parties expressly agree that the terms of this Agreement shall not be construed to constitute any such waiver. The requirements of this section shall survive the termination or expiration of this Agreement.

- d. Indemnification. The Parties agree to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the Fiscal Agent, and its officers, officials, agents, volunteers and employees from any liability, claims, losses, damages, costs, judgments, or expenses, including reasonable attorneys' and other professional fees, resulting directly or indirectly from any negligent, tortious or illegal act or omission, including without limitation, professional errors or omissions by Party (including its officers, employees, agents and subcontractors) arising from the performance of its services pursuant to this Agreement, and against all loss by reason of the failure of the Party, its agents, employees or subcontractors fully to perform all obligations under this Agreement. For clarification and not by way of limitation, this obligation to indemnify and hold harmless shall apply to all materials prepared or furnished pursuant to this Agreement, including, without limitation, claims resulting from any alleged infringement of copyright or any property right of another, and the unlawful disclosure or use of protected data or other noncompliance with the Records and Information provisions set forth in this agreement. The terms and provisions of this section shall survive the expiration, suspension or termination of this Agreement.
- e. **Employee Status.** All personnel and contractors of the individual Parties, while engaging in the performance of this Agreement, shall not be considered the employees or contractors of any other Party by way of this Agreement. The individual Parties shall be responsible for their own employees, officers, agents, contractors and subcontractors and such personnel shall not be entitled to any compensation, rights, or benefits of any kind from any of the other Parties to this Agreement.
- f. **Use of Contractors.** The Parties may individually engage contractors to perform WBIF Grant and other grant agreements and grant work plan projects and programs on behalf of CWRIA within their jurisdictions. Each individual Party retains primary responsibility for its' own contracts and compliance with this Agreement.
- g. Workers' Compensation, Prevailing Wage, and Municipal Contracting Law. The Parties agree to specifically comply with and ensure compliance with the following relating to employees, contractors, and subcontractors:
 - Comply with Minn. Stat. §176.181, Subd. 2, pertaining to workers' compensation insurance and insurance coverage.
 - Pay prevailing wage act for projects in accordance with Minn. Stat. §177.41 through 177.44.
 - Comply with the Uniform Municipal Contracting Law, specified in Minn. Stat. §471.345 and include supporting documentation of all bidding processes and bids.
- h. **Government Data Practices.** The Parties agree to comply with the Minnesota Government Data Practices Act, (Minn. Rule. Chapter 13), and the Official Records Act (Minn. Rule. Section 15.17), for the data collected, created, received, maintained, disseminated or stored by each respective party in relation to this Agreement and WBIF Grants and other funding agreements for the CWRIA.
- i. Record Audits. The Parties agree that in accordance with Minn. Stat. §16B.98, Subd. 8, their books, records, documents, and accounting procedures and practices relevant to the WBIF Grants and other funding agreements and work plans are subject to examination by the Fiscal Agent, BWSR, and the state or legislative auditor for the later of the following: a minimum of six years from the receipt and approval of final reports of CWRIA grants and other funding agreements, or the required period of time

to satisfy all state retention requirements.

- j. Publicity and Signage. The Parties agree to comply with publicity requirements related to work or services performed as part of the WBIF Grants and other funding agreements and work plans which require identification of BWSR or another grantor as a sponsoring agent. The Parties further agree they will not claim that the State or another grantor endorses its products or services as required by the funding agreement. In addition, the Parties agree they will comply with the requirements for project signage as provided in the BWSR grant agreement.
- k. **Intellectual Property Rights.** The Parties agree that all Intellectual Property Rights as defined in the WBIF Grant Agreements or other funding agreements, which are created and paid for under the same, belong to the State or another funding grantor as required by the funding agreement.
- Notices. Any notice required under this Agreement shall be sufficient if personally served or sent by
 prepaid, registered, or certified mail (return receipt requested), to the business address of the Party to
 whom it is directed.
- m. **Minnesota Law Governs.** The laws of the State of Minnesota shall govern this Agreement and the appropriate venue and jurisdiction for any litigation that may arise under this Agreement will be in Crow Wing County, State of Minnesota.
- n. Compliance with the Minnesota Constitution. The Parties each agrees to comply with the requirements of the Minnesota Constitution regarding use of the Clean Water Funds to supplement traditional sources of funding.
- o. **No Third Party Beneficiary Rights.** Nothing in this Agreement is intended or may be construed to create third party beneficiary rights or to give any person or entity, other than the Parties to this Agreement, any legal or equitable right, remedy, or claim under this Agreement.
- p. Assignments, Amendments and Waiver. The Parties shall not assign any rights and obligations, nor make amendments to any part of this Agreement unless the assignment and amendments are in compliance with the WBIF Grant Agreements or other funding Agreements and are in writing and signed by an authorized official of all Parties to this Agreement. No waiver of any default shall constitute a waiver of any other default or breach, whether of the same or other covenant or condition. No waiver, benefit privilege, or service voluntarily given or performed by a Party shall give any other Party any contractual right by custom, estoppel, or otherwise.
- q. Enforceability, Severability, and Reformation. If any provision of this Agreement shall be held to be invalid or unenforceable for any reason, the remaining provisions shall continue to be valid and enforceable. If a court finds that any provision of this Agreement is invalid or unenforceable, but that by limiting such provision it would become valid and enforceable, then such provision shall be deemed to be written, construed and enforced as so limited.
- r. Advancement. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed as requiring the Fiscal Agent to advance any SWCD funds in the event WBIF Grants or other CWRIA funds are insufficient to pay any obligation of the CWRIA or the Parties for any reason. Ineligible billings, programs, or projects under this Agreement, the WBIF Grant Agreements, and other CWRIA grants or funding shall remain the obligation of the individual contracting Party. That Party shall retain primary responsibility for its own contracts and compliance with this Agreement.
- **4. Termination.** Unless extended by written agreement of the Parties, this Agreement shall terminate upon the occurrence of one of the following events:

- a. Upon written agreement of all Parties; or
- b. Upon a written request to withdraw as Fiscal Agent, the Parties agree that a new Fiscal Agent will be appointed within 30 days of receipt of a written request to withdraw as Fiscal Agent.
- 5. Winding Down if Grant Program is Terminated. If a Grantor cancels or terminates its grant program for any reason, the Parties agree that remaining available funds will be paid, determined on a pro rata basis, for services satisfactorily performed under the grant or grant work plan; and once all available funds have been expended, all outstanding expenses relating to such services shall be the sole responsibility of the individual Party performing or contracting for the performance of said services.

Should there be any surplus funds after all payments have been made and distributed as provided by the grant budget, the Fiscal Agent shall distribute those funds as provided by the CWRIA Agreement, except that the Fiscal Agent shall continue to hold any grant monies and manage said monies in accordance with any grant or funding agreements then in force which obligates the Fiscal Agent to hold and/or manage such funds in accordance with those agreements.

- 6. Modification of Grant Agreement. The Fiscal Agent, on behalf of the CWRIA, retains the right to seek modification of the grant agreements and/or its corresponding grant work plan with the grantor. Before such modification occurs, the Fiscal Agent will review the details and rationale of such a modification with the CWRIA. The CWRIA will have the opportunity to provide feedback on such modification, and the Fiscal Agent will make an effort to incorporate such feedback prior to submitting such a modification to the grantor.
- 7. Fiscal Agent Reimbursement. The Fiscal Agent will be reimbursed from WBIF Grants and other funding agreements for time expended performing fiscal agent duties. Said reimbursement will occur at a minimum quarterly. BWSR billing rate calculators and itemization of time will be utilized.
- 8. Fiscal Agent Responsibilities. The Fiscal Agent on behalf of the CWRIA will perform the following responsibilities.
 - a. Present proposed grant applications (or funding requests) and subsequent grant agreements to the Fiscal Agent's governing board for approval and acceptance. Said documents are to be based on the IWIP and have been vetted through the Policy Committee and Technical Advisory Committee established in the CWRIA Agreement.
 - b. Submit the grant or funding application (or funding request) on behalf of the CWRIA. The Fiscal Agent will be the signatory on the corresponding agreement.
 - c. Administer the grant or funding as provided in the agreement and corresponding work plan. This includes serving as the point of contact for the agreement and budgetary and accounting services, such as management of all operating budget funds, payment for contracted services and relevant bookkeeping and record keeping.
 - d. Administer the disbursement of public funds in accordance with the terms of this Agreement, the grant or funding agreement and its corresponding work plan, the purposes of the IWIP, and state and federal laws, including posting grant information on the SWCD's website and completing all grant reporting requirements (ex. BWSR's elink system).
 - e. Establish a separate fund or funds for management of CWRIA grant monies.
 - f. County Accounting policies and procedures shall apply to the WBIF Grant and all other CWRIA fund(s) managed by the Fiscal Agent during the term of this Agreement. All funds shall be accounted for

- according to generally accepted accounting principles.
- g. Maintain all pertinent books, records, documents and accounting procedures and practices required under the WBIF Grants, all other CWRIA grants and funds, and by state and federal law and make the same available to the CWRIA and the State Auditor upon reasonable notice.
- h. Maintain all records related to the fund or funds and retain them in accordance with the record retention policy requirements of the Minnesota State Auditor.
- i. Annually provide a full and complete audit report of the WBIF Grants and all other CWRIA grants and funds per Minn. Stat. §471.59, Subd. 3.
- j. Provide, at a minimum, quarterly accounting of the funds, receipts, and disbursements in relation to the WBIF Grant and all other grants and funding received on behalf of the CWRIA, in a timely manner to both the Plan Coordinator and Policy Committee of the CWRIA.
- k. Work collaboratively with the Policy Committee, Steering Committee, Grant Administrator, and Plan Coordinator, established under CWRIA, in performance of the responsibilities contained in this agreement.
- 9. Parties' Responsibilities. The Parties completing work on behalf of the CWRIA for Watershed- Based Implementation Funding Grants ("WBIF Grants") or any other funding agreement for the CWRIA, will perform the following responsibilities:
 - a. Comply with the provisions contained within the WBIF Grant Agreement and the corresponding Grant Work Plan, as well as other grants and funding agreements entered into on behalf of the CWRIA.
 - b. Adhere to all requirements, policies, and procedures set forth in the most recent version of the BWSR's Grant Administration Manual, the applicable Request for Proposal (RFP) for the WBIF Grant, as well as any other grant or funding agreement program guidance and policies entered into on behalf of the CWRIA.
 - c. Comply with the most recent version of all policies and procedures set forth by the CWRIA via its Policy Committee and/or Steering Committee.
 - d. Submit to the Fiscal Agent, quarterly invoices with all supporting information. Invoices shall be submitted within 30 days after the quarter ends. Said invoices will itemize project and/or program costs consistent with the approved grant agreement, grant work plan, or other funding agreement. The Fiscal Agent will then distribute, on a quarterly basis, the grant funds based on approved invoices. Once all available grant funds have been expended, all outstanding expenses relating to such services shall be the sole responsibility of the individual Party performing or contracting for the performance of said service, unless additional grant funds have been made available to the Fiscal Agent for the purposes of the CWRIA.
 - Monitor all hours staff worked on any project or program under the grant and report said hours on a
 quarterly basis to the Fiscal Agent with all supporting information, utilizing an approved BWSR or
 other time tracking requirement.
 - f. Incur all costs within the effective and expiration dates on the WBIF or other applicable grant agreements.
 - g. All services and work performed under the WBIF Grant Agreements or other grant agreements or

funding sources must meet the State of Minnesota's or other grantor's satisfaction. If services or work is found unsatisfactory or performed in violation of:

- WBIF Grant Agreement and/or Grant Work Plan or other grant or funding agreements.
- Any grant required policies and procedures, including but not limited to those set forth in the
 most recent version of the BWSR's Grant Administration Manual and Grant Program Guidance
 and Policies from BWSR related to the WBIF Grants.
- Most recent version of all policies and procedures set forth by the CWRIA via its Policy Committee and/or Implementation Team and/or
- Federal, state, or local statutes, laws, rules, regulations, or ordinances,

the individual Party performing the work or services (or contracting for the same) shall not be reimbursed by the Fiscal Agent under this agreement and shall be solely responsible for repayment of already-reimbursed funds relating to said work or services to the Fiscal Agent.

The individual Party will indemnify and hold the Fiscal Agent harmless if such a finding occurs and shall return grant and other funds paid on behalf of CWRIA to the Fiscal Agent within 60 days of notification by the State or other grantor of funding of such finding.

10. Counterparts. This Agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts, each of which shall constitute one and the same instrument.

The CWRIA Fiscal Agent Agreement heretofore in effect is hereby repealed and superseded by this Agreement.

PREVAILING WAGE LAW EXEMPTION FOR SWCDs

WHEREAS, the State of Minnesota requires prevailing wage to be used for projects that utilize state funding; and

WHEREAS, the rule was interpreted to not apply to Soil and Water Conservation District (SWCD) projects prior to 2024; and

WHEREAS, the Minnesota prevailing wage law was updated during the 2024 Legislative session; and

WHEREAS, the definition of a project in statute Ch.177.42 Subd. 2 states; "Project" means demolition, erection, construction, alteration, improvement, restoration, remodeling, or repairing of a public building, structure, facility, land, or other public work, which includes any work suitable for and intended for use by the public, or for the public benefit, financed in whole or part by state funds. Project also includes demolition, erection, construction, alteration, improvement, restoration, remodeling, or repairing of a building, structure, facility, land, or public work when the acquisition of property, predesign, design, or demolition is financed in whole or part by state funds; and

WHEREAS, the new language includes projects "for the public benefit" which could include projects on private property financed with state funds passed through a SWCD; and

WHEREAS, SWCDs work includes providing plans, specifications and bid packets to landowners to receive bids from contractors and landowners hire the contactors to install conservation practices on their land; and

WHEREAS, SWCDs as a grantee of state funds, use those funds to reimburse landowners for a portion of their expenses to install conservation practices and do not hire or pay any contractors; and

WHEREAS, conservation projects are typically smaller in size and cost compared to multi-million-dollar projects for roads and bridges; and

WHEREAS, local contractors that install conservation practices are typically small-scale businesses and there are a limited number of them available in each SWCD; and

WHEREAS, prevailing wage requirements may be foreign, difficult, and overwhelming for landowners and small-scale contractors to administer, which is likely to negatively impact response to bid solicitation; and

WHEREAS, prevailing wage requirements will increase costs to install conservation projects resulting in a reduction of the number of practices installed, with the funding available; and

WHEREAS, some landowners have the ability to install projects with their own equipment and labor; and

WHEREAS, SWCDs provide services to landowners as a contractor to install some conservation practices similar to the Minnesota Conservation Corps; and

WHEREAS, the Minnesota Conservation Corps are exempt from the prevailing wage requirements.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: That MASWCD work with the Department of Labor and other stakeholders to advocate to the MN State Legislature that conservation projects installed by private landowners, who receive financial compensation from state funds be exempt from the Prevailing Wage statute.
