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Minutes from the August 14, 2025 Regular Board Meeting

Chairperson Wendel called the Thursday, August 14, 2025 meeting to order at 8:30 a.m.

The meeting was held in person at the Historic Courthouse in the Commissioner's Board room located at 215 1st Ave S, STE 104, Long Prairie, MN 56347.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Call for Introductions.

Board members present in person were: Wayne Wendel, Dale Katterhagen, Barb James, Tom Williamson and Larry Bebus.

Others present in person were: Deja Anton, District Manager, Adam Ossefoort, Division Director, Sarah Katterhagen, Program Coordinator, Dylan Pratt, Conservation Technician, Josh Votruba, Conservation Technician, Kasen Christiansen, Conservation Technician, Alyssa Scheve, Conservation Technician, Jessica Moore, Conservation Technician, Luke Thoma, NRCS, Bob Byers, County Commissioner, Tim Denny, County Commissioner and Darren Mayers, Board Conservationist.

Wendel asked if there were any additions or corrections to the agenda. Katterhagen made a motion, seconded by Williamson to accept the revised agenda for the regular August 14, 2025 meeting.

Bebus made a motion, seconded by James to approve the minutes as distributed from the July 10, 2025 regular board meeting. Affirmative: Wendel, Katterhagen, James, Williamson and Bebus. Motion Carried.

Wendel asked the board to review July 2025 Treasurer's Report. James made a motion, seconded by Williamson to accept July's 2025 Treasurer's Report with receipts totaling \$239,751.35 and disbursements totaling \$104,090.81. Affirmative: Wendel, Katterhagen, James, Williamson and Bebus. Motion Carried.

Wendel called for conflict of interest. None was reported.

Reports:

Commissioner's Report: Commissioner Denny reported the County finance team is reviewing budgets. Commissioner Byers reported the County hired an Attorney to help with Planning and Zoning violations.

Director Report: Ossefoort reported he is looking forward to working with the Commissioners and new Attorney on the Planning and Zoning violations. The Planning Commission and Board of Adjustment have been

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busy. Lake Osakis area is looking at a centralized septic system. The comprehensive plan meeting was rescheduled.

Staff Visual Report: Pratt presented his visual report. See his visual report for photos. He has been busy with attending Cover Crop workshops, helping with tree planter logistics and attended the SWCD Conservation tour.

Manager Report Staff Accomplishments: Anton reported S. Katterhagen attended BWSR's Grants Administration Manuel (GAM) training, prepared the advertisements for the Nitrate Clinic open house, worked with MIS on creating a Tree Planter calendar for scheduling, and is sending out second notices for feedlot registrations.

Anton reported Christiansen is busy working on Easements, Julig's exclusion fencing project, spot checks, tree planter logistics, observation well monitoring program, and attended a field windbreak training.

Anton reported Votruba attended the Lake Beauty Association meeting, attended a cover crop workshop and working on easement spot checks.

Anton reported Moore has been shadowing staff and attending trainings.

Anton reported Pratt has been busy reviewing a feedlot permit, attending trainings and workshops.

Anton reported Scheve has been working with MAWQCP (Ag Water program) producers, assisted with the Villard Soil Health event with MN Soil Health Coalition, on the radio show, working on easements and attending trainings.

SWCD Manager Report: See printed report that was provided in the board packet. Anton also did a mid-year review of the 2025 Plan of Action. See PowerPoint for more details.

NRCS Report: Thoma reported NRCS is working on CSP and EQIP requests and 1026 requests (Wetland). Anton shared an article about NRCS just funding alfalfa. Thoma reported it would have to be new to the crop rotation and would have to showing water quality improvement.

FSA Report: No report.

1W1P- Sauk River Report: No report. An upcoming policy meeting on August 21, 2025.

1W1P Red Eye Report: Anton informed board there will be a Fall policy meeting.

1W1P Long Prairie Report: The policy meeting was moved to November and all the CRRP incentive funds have been encumbered.

1W1P Crow Wing Report: No report.

1W1P Mississippi Brainerd Report: No report.

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BWSR Report: Mayers reported RCPP funding will be released soon. Mayers gave a presentation on board vacancies.

Byers, Denny, Pratt, Votruba, Christiansen, Scheve and Moore left the meeting at 10:22 a.m.

Bebus made a motion, seconded by James to approve A Resolution Regarding the Administration of the Minnesota Wetland Conservation Act, R#20250814-6.1.

Discussion: This resolution was tabled in July to added termination verbiage.

Anton provided the board a draft copy of the 2026 Budget for Soil and Water. Anton will meet with the SWCD finance committee to review the budget, will bring back at the September board meeting and will look for final approval in October.

The board reviewed the tree rental agreement. Rental will begin September 1, 2025.

Anton would like a Supervisor to write an article about Enviro Fest. The article would be due September 24, 2025.

The Future of Tillage a strip till event will be held on August 19, 2025.

SWCD Governance 101 training will be held September 10 & 11, 2025 at the Holiday Inn, St. Cloud, MN. Bebus will be attending the event.

Enviro Fest will be held on Thursday, September 18, 2025.

The Soil Health and Grazing event on Lake Latimer will be on September 25, 2025.

The FY2026 Ob Well Grant agreement was signed and approved on July 7, 2025 in the amount of \$6,240.

The FY2026 Soil Health Grant was signed by the Manager on August 5, 2025 in the amount of \$180,000. The grant agreement is pending BWSR signature.

Manager had a phone discussion with the Chair on June 12, 2025 to encumber Crow Wing WBIF cost share funds for Anthony Murch's in the amount of \$1,200 for Forest Stewardship plan.

The Manager approved the use of Feedlot Performance funds for Jeremy and Hope Middendorf for a Pit Investigation project in October 2024.

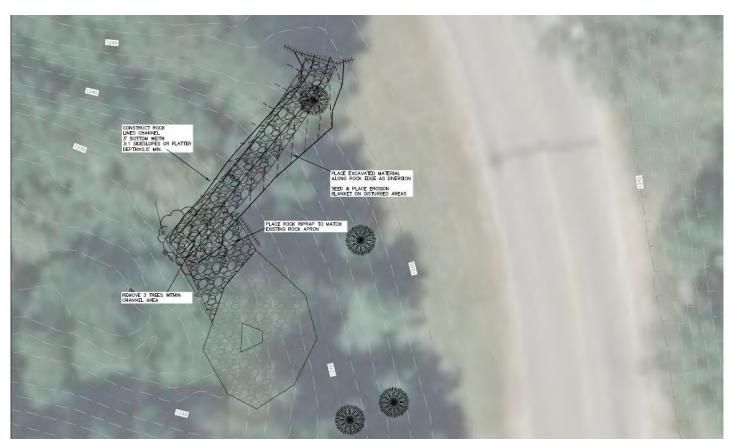
