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Minutes from the September 11, 2025 Regular Board Meeting

The meeting was held in person at the Historic Courthouse in the Commissioner's Board room located at 215 1st Ave S, STE 104, Long Prairie, MN 56347.

Prior to the start of the meeting, Chairperson Wendel called for a moment of silence in honor of 9/11 and for the losses of those involved with the Annunciation school shooting and those affected by political violence.

Chairperson Wendel called the Thursday, September 11, 2025 meeting to order at 8:30 a.m.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Call for Introductions. Nathan Wiese from the Department of Ag was a guest.

Board members present in person were: Wayne Wendel, Dale Katterhagen, Barb James, and Tom Williamson. Larry Bebus was absent from the meeting.

Others present in person were: Deja Anton, District Manager, Adam Ossefoort, Division Director, Dylan Pratt, Conservation Technician, Josh Votruba, Conservation Technician, Alyssa Scheve, Conservation Technician, Jessica Moore, Conservation Technician, Luke Thoma, NRCS, Nate Wiese, MAWQCP and Darren Mayers, Board Conservationist.

Wendel asked if there were any additions or corrections to the agenda. Katterhagen made a motion, seconded by James to accept the revised agenda for the regular September 11, 2025 meeting.

Wendel asked the board to review the August 2025 Treasurer's Report. District Manager summarized disbursement and revenues. Katterhagen made a motion, seconded by Williamson to accept August's 2025

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Treasurer's Report with receipts totaling \$312,549.30 and disbursements totaling \$229,370.65. Affirmative: Wendel, Katterhagen, James, and Williamson. Motion Carried.

Wendel called for conflict of interest. Williamson identified a conflict with agenda item 3.8.

The board shared in celebrating the addition of \$7,1991.89 in feedlot performance credits received for fiscal year 24 for a total of \$29,852.18. Thank you to the feedlot staff for there hard work leading too additional funding.

Reports:

Commissioner's Report: No Commissioners present at the meeting.

Director Report: Ossefoort reported that the Planning Commission reviewed the first cannabis application during the September Planning Commission hearing. The item was tabled for additional review and will be heard again in October.

Staff Visual Report: Votruba presented his visual report. See his visual report for photos. Projects viewed included Benson, Wykeham Township RIM easement, Brunn, Zander, Pampy, and Gordon Township CREP/RIM Easement.

Manager Report Staff Accomplishments: Anton walked through a brief report of each staff persons accomplishments over the past month.

SWCD Manager Report: See printed report that was provided in the board packet. Anton shared a PowerPoint for activates happening within each Supervisor District.

NRCS Report: Thoma reported NRCS is wrapping up EQIP planning. Training for the RCPP irrigation program was completed. Todd County has 6 or 7 applications already. Thoma has also been assisting Riley with finalizing CRP conservation planning.

FSA Report: No report.

1W1P- Sauk River Report: Williamson reported that they reviewed Bylaws during the August meeting. No additional report.

1W1P Red Eye Report: Next policy meeting will be held on October 20.

1W1P Long Prairie Report: Next meeting will be held in November.

1W1P Crow Wing Report: No report.

1W1P Mississippi Brainerd Report: Watershed will be reviewing and planning for the next round of funding.

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MAWQCP Report: Wiese introduced himself, provided an update, and explained the program. Mayers asked if the program continues to work with land owners after they become certified. Wiese stated that yes, the program does and provided an explanation of when and why. Williamson asked what happens when a renter takes over land that was previously certified under the land owner. Wiese provided contact information to work with the renter on becoming certified.

BWSR Report: Mayers provided a PowerPoint presentation for educational purposes on Comprehensive Watershed Management Planning and Forestry Planning. He shared the reduction calculator FERN. Mayers urged technical staff to research the water quality benefits coming from each practice to make sure it aligns with funding source. There is more critical analysis on forestry in regards to water quality benefits occurring across the state.

Pratt presented the Dolezal cover crop project for informational purposes. This item was not ready for board action. No action taken.

James made a motion, seconded by Katterhagen to approve encumbering C24-0198 Miss - Brainerd cost share funds for Jim Johnson, C#20250911-3.3 in the amount of \$1,794.75 for 25 acres of cover crops. Affirmative: Wendel, Katterhagen, James, and Williamson. Motion Carried.

Scheve presented the Statema cover crop project for informational purposes. This item was not ready for board action. No action taken.

Scheve presented the Asfeld cover crop project for informational purposes. This item was not ready for board action. No action taken.

Anton further presented information for the Board about the proposed cost of employees for 2026 and the potential categories for reimbursement to Todd County under the SWCD/County Agreement.



Recent water testing has shown increased amounts of sediment coming from the inlets into Little Birch Lake, the primary contribution coming off of this intermittent stream. The purpose of this project is to stabilize a large actively eroding ravine located off of Almond Dr in Birchdale Township. During large rain events large amounts of sediment flow downstream into Little Birch Lake and flood out the Waldvogel and neighboring properties. The neighbors constructed berms to protect their home. Large scour holes in the lake have also resulted from massive flooding and erosion. This has been a project five years in development with multiple landowners, the lake association, and the township involved in multiple meetings and site visits. This project has little benefit to him, but because his land is the source of the water, he is willing to kick in to help pay. The options were to do nothing or to add in a rock channel with no collection point, tile or overflow protection. 



After red oak, basswood, ash, maple, and other desired tree species seedlings are established; identify and mark approximately 200 stems per acre (15' x 15' spacing) then protect the located seedlings from deer browsing by installing 6' tall tree tubes on them. The tubes are split open along one side so they can be placed around a desired tree species seedling then the opening is fastened together using zip ties that are also fastened to flexible stakes then the tube and stake combination is held in place around the seedling driving the stakes into the ground and by mounding loose soil around the bottom of the tubes. 
